### CHRIST THE KING—A DAY TO PRAY FOR TRUE FREEDOM

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925 with his encyclical Quas primas ("In the first") to respond to growing secularism and atheism. He recognized that attempting to "thrust Jesus Christ and His Holy law" out of public life would result in continuing discord among people and nations. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. It is a day to pray for the freedom that only Jesus can give. This is a freedom that allows us to build a

society of true justice, peace and solidarity with each other.

During the early twentieth century, in Mexico, Russia, and some parts of Europe, militantly secularistic regimes threatened not just the Catholic Church and its faithful, but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's encyclical gave Catholics hope and – while governments around them crumbled – the assurance that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind" (Quas primas, 7). The USCCB encourages Catholics to learn more about this important feast day. Resources, including a brief background on Quas primus, are available at <u>www.usccb.org/ChristtheKing</u>.

Our readings this year feature the image of the Lord as a shepherd. The image of a shepherd is a beautiful scriptural image that refers to a benevolent ruler. Like a shepherd caring for his flock, a good king is one who feeds and protects his people. The Psalm calls to mind the image of a shepherd king. In some translations, the first line of this Psalm is rendered as "The Lord rules me," rather than the more familiar "The Lord is my shepherd." The Lord who rules as a good shepherd protects his people and delivers them from their enemies.

One key in our readings is that the Lord is the one who brings about transformation. He is the Incarnate Lord who came down from heaven for us. It is tempting to think that we can solve the crises we face on our own. To be sure, we should use our gifts and virtues to contribute to the renewal of our Church and broader society. But at the same time, the Lord is the one who leads us beside still waters. The renewal of the churches of Guardian Angels and Saint Nicholas must be informed by prayer, in which we ask the King of the Universe to be our shepherd. May our shepherd lead us in our small groups this Lent. May He lead us in all of our activity within the walls of our churches and outside of them so that we may be his light to the world!
