## A NEW PENTECOST CAN TAKE PLACE IN SMALL GROUPS

Last Pentecost, 1800 people gathered in Williams Arena with Archbishop Hebda, Bishop Williams, and Dr. Mary Healy, guest speaker, to pray for the success of small groups and to learn about the power of the Holy Spirit. The day was a day filled with great hope in a new Pentecost for our local Church. Since then, each parish's Synod Evangelization Team has invited a "72" to consider taking a leadership role in a small group and to undergo a seven-week series of training for that purpose. This series of articles attempts to summarize that training.

The archbishop's vision is that parishes would be a "family of families." He wants it to be normal to be a member of a small group. You are not required to be in one, but the archbishop desires that we have a culture of that being Catholic is to be a member of a small group. Think about preparation for Baptism or for marriage as including being a member of a small group. How much more powerful and welcoming would it be if this were the norm in our sacramental preparation? How much more of an opportunity would we have to make these sacramental moments in our lives a time of new belonging and transformation? These types of groups are pastoral in nature. That is, they are oriented more around welcoming, introduction to the Christian life, and introduction to the life of the parish.

The archbishop wants us to have such groups that renew our parish from within, but also groups of longer-term parishioners who are equipped to move out in evangelization. We will call them "cell groups". Think of a body. By nature, cells divide and grow. Many cell groups leave an empty chair to recall to mind that there is room for a new member to join. So how will we really do that? How will we become comfortable to invite others to join us? The Archbishop has chosen a model called Parish Evangelization Cell Systems. In 1983 Msgr. Michael Eivers, then pastor of Saint Boniface church in Pembroke Pines, Florida sensed that there was something missing in his parish. He knew that being devoted to our Lord, Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament was essential. He knew that a personal experience of the Holy Spirit was also essential. And so he sought to emphasize these experiences and knowledge of them in his parish. But then, he traveled to South Korea for a seminar where he caught the vision of small group ministry that Pastor Paul Yonggi Cho had developed in some 20,000 cell groups at his parish in the city of Seoul.

What Msgr. Eivers found was the answer to what was lacking in the life of his parish. At the time, he said, "We're all hurting and we're all looking for healing. You can't get that...if the group is too big and too anonymous. Where can you get it? You get it in small groups." He returned home to apply the model of cell ministry that he had encountered in South Korea, with its emphasis on prayer, a solid organizational structure, and evangelization.

Meanwhile, another priest, Father Piergiogio Perini of Milan, Italy, visited Msgr. Eivers' parish, Saint Boniface, in 1986. Inspired by what he saw, he summoned about 40 parishioners to share the commitment of transforming the parish of Saint Eustorgio in Milan into a community burning with faith and committed to evangelization through cell groups. This experience became contagious and has now spread to many countries. On the feast of Divine Mercy, April 12, 2015, the Pontifical Council for the Laity approved the Parish Evangelization Cells System Statutes. In doing so, the council paid tribute to this hope when it noted that PECS was a blessing for the Church in "awakening in pastors the awareness of their mission to convert the parish into a community of ardent faith, where members are 'agents of evangelization' and the parish is a center of constant missionary outreach (see Pope Francis, Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Guadium, 28)."

Next week, I will write more on what Parish Evangelization Cell Systems look like and how and why they have worked to transform many in parishes.


