COME, LORD JESUS, COME!



The Great Commission presents us with the last and definitive words of our Risen Lord, Jesus, before his Ascension into heaven. It is to be understood as the final and most important task that He entrusts to us. It is found in various expressions such as in Matthew 28: 19-21: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." You may be wondering what this has to do with Christmas. It has a lot to do with Christmas in that the God who became flesh for us as a little, humble child, desires that we meet Him, that we

encounter Him personally. Our God is a personal, loving God who did not stay in the heavens, but became a person like us in order that we experience Him intimately. While the duty to evangelize rests in the parting words of Jesus, the interior force must come from this experience of meeting the Risen Jesus that enlivens the hearts of each believer. Whoever has authentically encountered Jesus receives in his or her heart the call of the Holy Spirit to become an evangelist. Mary Magdalene is a great example. Having experienced the liberating power of Jesus at the depths of her own being she could hardly be found outside his company from that point on. So attached to Jesus by love was Mary Magdalene that she clung even to his empty tomb. For this reason, the Risen Lord entrusted to her before all others the joy of the resurrection. She was the first to see the empty tomb and for this reason she is known in our tradition as the "Apostle to the Apostles." Saint Paul VI, in his Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Nuntiandi (On Evangelization in the Modern World) written in 1975, reminded the Church that all Christians are to go out in some way and proclaim the Good News. Indeed, the Church exists in order to evangelize. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, reinforced this by saying that all of us are asked to obey his call to go forth from our comfort zone to reach the peripheries in need of the light of the Gospel. In her seminal work, Forming Intentional Disciples, Catholic author Sherry Weddell cites a jarring statistic from the sweeping 2005 study on religious practice in the United States titled, Pillars of Faith: American Congregations and Their Partners. When asked whether spreading the faith was a high priority, 75% of conservative Protestant congregations and 57% of African American congregations responded yes, but only 6% of Catholic parishes did so. When asked whether they sponsored evangelization activities in their parishes, only 3% responded yes (p. 51). Only six percent said yes! When we do, we make the Incarnate Jesus present to others. We make Him a reality in the lives of many for whom He is not so much a reality. We make Him present as one who we recognize in our daily lives and belong to. He becomes a credible and real alternative to the way of our culture that has great meaning, purpose, and destiny. So what prevents us from going forth? Two kinds of fear present themselves. Usually it means going forth from our zone of comfort and we realize that such going forth needs to be adapted to the changing scenarios and ever new challenges to this mission. There is a way of evangelization that is called "ad gentes" meaning "to the nations" that does involve what might for many of us conjure up fear. This way can involve going door-to -door or some very public style of preaching. It also has involved missionaries who set sail to far-away lands. This type of evangelization is, indeed, essential to the life of the Church. Yet, we might say that it is limited to those who have received a special formation and calling. At the same time, we hear as St. John Paul II reminds us: "We must revive in ourselves the burning conviction of Paul, who cried out: 'Woe to me if Ido not preach the Gospel' (1 Corinthians 9:16). This passion will not fail to stir in the Church a new sense of mission, which cannot be left to a group of 'specialists' but must involve the responsibility of all the members of the People of God." So we can rely on a second type of evangelization called Oikos evangelization. The word, "Oikos" in Greek means "household." It conveys the idea of using our existing relationships to evangelize. Think about who your oikos is. They are the people, whether family members, friends, or co-workers with whom you relate to on a regular basis. Next week, I will talk more on Oikos Evangelization. May God grant you a beautiful Christmas day as we celebrate our Savior's birth among us!

OUR CHRISTMAS WISH LIST

Actually it isn't a list, it is really only one thing. Would you be willing to donate to Guardian Angel's Livestream Ministry project?

Each week, Guardian Angels records and streams the 10 a.m. Mass (as well as some Holy Days, Funerals, etc.). The recorded Masses are then available for viewing any time on GA's YouTube channel (the links are <u>www.gachaska.org</u>). The Livestream ministry helps bring GA's Mass to homebound and, in the case of funerals, friends and family members who might not be able to be here in person to see the Mass. During the Pandemic, our livestream channel provided a vital link for everyone to continue participating in the Mass from the safety of their homes.

For the past four years, we have been using aging reused videocams (sourced from the school and donated by parishioners) and other equipment that is starting to show its age and is becoming unreliable. It is time to update the equipment and install cameras that are reliable and able to be controlled from the Livestreamer's desk in the choir loft (the current cameras must be moved by hand and this proves to be challenging in a full choir loft!).

Furthermore, we are working with the City of Chaska to air the Mass on one of the local cable access channels so that those without a computer can simply tune into the Mass on a television. We need reliable and updated cameras in order to move this into the next phase.

We have sourced equipment that is modern, reliable and affordable. Guardian Angels has a talented and dedicated group of volunteer livestreamers. The only thing we are missing is YOU - someone willing to help us fund this upgrade project!

So, if you are looking for a great way to make an end-of-year donation to a worthwhile project, we hope you might consider helping us raise the funds to purchase this new equipment. Thanks in part to several generous donations (including several from the livestream volunteers) we have already collected more than half the funds needed to make this purchase. If you are able to contribute, please contact the Parish office or simply enclose your donation in an envelope labeled Live Streaming and put in the collection basket.
