

Archdiocesan Parish Planning Team to Work with Our Area

I met with Archbishop Hebda a few weeks ago to express some of the challenges that we face in



our Chaska/Carver area and how we can best be the Catholic Church in our area.

Precipitating this meeting is the fact that we currently have two Saturday evening Masses at our parishes; the 4 p.m. Saturday evening in Carver, and the 5:30 p.m. in Chaska. The Carver Mass is frequently full, with about 150 attending, and the Chaska Mass, in a church that seats 450, has plenty of room. It is a challenge for the pastor going back and forth between the parishes on Saturdays (Sundays as well). It is difficult to spend quality time after Mass greeting people, and it is difficult to have good confession times at both parishes on Saturdays.

Noteworthy, too, is that more than a few people at the 4 p.m. Mass in Carver are from GA in Chaska, and many attending the 5:30 p.m. Mass in Chaska have expressed a desire for a 4:00 p.m. Mass in Chaska. However, the 4:00 p.m. time is the largest of the two Masses at St. Nicholas, and so simply joining the two Masses in Chaska, would essentially call into question the future of the parish of St. Nicholas.

The Archbishop recommended that the Archdiocesan Parish Planning Team (APP) come out to both parishes to better understand our Chaska/Carver region, the challenges and opportunities that are at hand, and to make recommendations to the Archbishop for moving the Church forward in our area.

The APP is composed of lay people and clergy who consider the challenges in a region, study the situation, and then make recommendations for how to proceed. I am grateful that the Archbishop is sending them to us. This Spring the team will come out to visit both St. Nicholas and Guardian Angels to assess our parish life situations. They will meet with parish leadership, review the properties, ministries, and finances, and make their recommendations. Please pray for this process as it begins. It will be challenging for sure, but hopefully it will set us on a path for a better future for the church in our area.

SAINT KATHARINE DREXEL (1858-1955) March 3

Born into Philadelphia society, Katharine was an infant when she lost her mother. Her father remarried and the couple taught their daughters that their wealth was a "gift on loan" to be shared with the poor, whom they fed and cared for in their home. Invited by priest friends to witness firsthand the destitution on Native American reservations,

Katharine resolved to devote her inheritance to this apostolate and enter a contemplative order. When, however, in private audience, she begged Leo XIII to send missionaries to staff the schools she was building, the pope replied, "My child, why not become a missionary yourself?" Katharine renounced a twentymillion-dollar fortune and founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, adoring Christ present in the Eucharist and ministering to Christ suffering in victims of racial discrimination. Her Sisters established over sixty schools nationwide, including Xavier University, New Orleans, the first dedicated to professional education for African Americans. In 2000, John Paul II canonized "Mother Drexel," praising her "excellent example of practical charity and generous solidarity with the less fortunate, long the distinguishing mark of American Catholics." —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. Greetings from Guardian Angels Catholic School!

This week at our Ash Wednesday School mass we all received ashes on our foreheads. For some of our younger students our Catholic traditions bring up many good questions for all of us to reflect upon. Our students are so blessed to be a part of the faithful community where they can feel comfortable asking "Why do we do this?"

Here are a few reminders for all to share and pass on....

Is Ash Wednesday a holy day of obligation? Ash Wednesday is actually not a holy day of obligation. We come together on this day to recognize the beginning of Lent.

Can I receive ashes even though I haven't made my First Communion? Yes, everyone young and old can receive ashes.

Why do we get ashes on our foreheads? As a reminder of our own mortality.

What is fasting? Do children need to fast? Fasting means that you have one regular size meal, and 2 small meals which combined are not as large as your regular meal. There are only 2 days that the Catholic church requires fasting (you can choose to do more). Those under 18 are not required to fast. We can encourage simple eating and refraining from extra snacking during Lent.

Do I have to give something up for Lent? Young children are not required to do this, however, they can give up something simple. Even preschoolers can choose a sacrifice during Lent.

Who should abstain from eating meat? Abstaining from meat is required for everyone ages 14 on up. We can encourage our young children to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays during Lent.

These traditions are part of our faith. Helping our youth understand why we do certain traditions deepens their understanding of our faith and their relationship with God.

May this Lenten season bring you peace and a little closer to God.





SANTA CATALINA DREXEL (1858-1955)

3 de marzo

Nació en Filadelfia, en el seno de una familia muy rica. Debido a la muerte inesperada de su madre, su padre contrajo nupcias por segunda vez. De ambos aprendió a orar y a cuidar de los pobres y su mismo hogar se abrió para ellos. Puesto que era muy rica tuvo la oportunidad de viajar a los Estados Unidos y este viaje le transformó para siempre, pues pudo presenciar la discriminación y sufrimiento a que eran sometidos los afroamericanos y nativos americanos. Años después, renunció a una fortuna de 14 millones de dólares (250 millones actualmente) y se unió a las Hermanas de la Misericordia. Posteriormente fundó la Congregación de las Hermanas del Santísimo Sacramento, añadiendo a los votos religiosos uno muy especial: el cuidado y educación de afroamericanos y nativos americanos. Al momento de su muerte se habían construido 50 misiones en 16 estados, un sistema de escuelas para afroamericanos, 40 centros misioneros y 23 escuelas rurales. Gracias a ella se construyó la Universidad Xavier, en Nuevo Orleáns, la primera dedicada a la educación profesional de afroamericanos.
