The Holy Spirit was at work for sure! Praise God! There is great momentum with our school and one can feel it these days. Our enrollment is up 30% this year, and God willing, we are poised to have well over 100 students next year with the interest that we are seeing now. SAINT FRANCES OF ROME (1384-1440)

March 9

Nature and human nature—plagues and wars—turned late medieval Rome into a living hell, particularly for the sick and poor. Frances, by birth and marriage was well provided for, was a devoted wife and mother; but like Benedictine Oblates, who to this day "pray and work" while living with their families and working in the world, she joined like-

minded laywomen friends in ministering to society's most vulnerable. Frances' charity was not only "hands on" but "in home." Her palace became a hospital after the plague claimed two of her three children. When her husband's death ended their loving marriage of forty years, Frances joined other widowed Oblates in community. In an interesting link to the United States, our nation's premier religious congregation for women of color, the Oblate Sisters of Providence, in 1833 established bonds of spiritual communion with these Oblates of Saint Frances in Rome. CHANGE

Lent is all about change and change is usually not easy. In order to change we have to leave something behind. Today we hear about a very old man who decides to answer God's call. Abram experiences a tremendous amount of change when he

Greetings from Guardian Angels Catholic School!

A teacher purchasing snacks for her students before a field trip because she knows most will go without unless she does. Another teacher brings in snow pants so those who don't have any can participate in winter fun. We have several teachers who come in early (6:20 a.m.) daily and others who stay late to make sure all players have a ride home. Others silently pay for field trips or other supplies for those in need. You can see God's love and grace through our parents: The countless hours of volunteering at our school events. The outreach towards each other watching kids, giving rides, making meals and someone to lean on. You can see God's love and grace through the support of our parish community all throughout the year. SANTA FRANCISCA ROMANA (1384-1440)

9 de marzo

Francisca nació en una familia cristiana donde aprendió a amar a Dios y a los pobres. Contrajo nupcias muy joven, pero jamás abandonó su deseo de servir a los pobres, labor pastoral que fue apoyada por Lorenzo, su esposo. Además de ser ejemplar esposa y madre, oraba constantemente y salía del palacio vestida con ropas humildes para ir a visitar a los enfermos y llevar alimento a los pobres. Su amor por los marginados era tan grande que cuando azotaron inundaciones y pestes no dudó en abrir su palacio para que se convirtiera en hospital v refugio de damnificados, cuidando personalmente de ellos y ofreciéndoles alimento. Este amor por los pobres lo compartió con una de sus cuñadas, con quien no sólo practicó la caridad sino compartió el sueño de ser religiosa. Siendo esposa y madre fundó la comunidad de las Oblatas de María, cuyo carisma era vivir en el hogar sirviendo a los pobres. Se unió a esta comunidad religiosa una vez que enviudó y sus hijos crecieron. Para los ciudadanos de Roma fue un vivo ejemplo de Cristo.
