

We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call Jean in the Parish Office.



Not physically offering the Sign of Peace, nor physically greeting people at Mass Emptying the holy water fonts. Small bottles of holy water are available for you to sign yourself with and you may take the bottle with you in your purse, or pocket. Bring it with you to Mass and use it to sign yourself, and your family.

For those who desire to receive Communion on the tongue, please come to the priest's line. All other Eucharistic Ministers will distribute in the hand.

Steps that you can take -which I'm sure you've heard already:

Frequently wash your hands

Cover your cough into your sleeve preferably Avoid gatherings anywhere, including Mass, if you are not feeling well


Be aware of your own personal health risks given your own health history and take steps to protect yourself

Don't hesitate to call or visit a clinic if you have a fever, cough, or trouble breathing,

If the situation nationally and locally changes, other stronger measures will have to be taken. We will follow instructions from civil authorities and church authorities if that is needed.

For now, let us all do our best with our personal and family hygiene practices. Let us turn to the Lord in prayer. Pray for those suffering from this disease, pray for those who have died, and pray for the health care workers who are courageously on the front lines of this battle, risking their own health for the benefit of others. Prayer is needed, humility is needed, and common sense is needed.







SAN PATRICIO (c. 389-461)

17 de marzo

Patricio nació en la actual Escocia en la familia de un soldado romano. A los 16 años fue capturado por piratas irlandeses y sometido a seis años de pastoreo y sufrimiento. Luego de varios intentos pudo escapar, regresó a su tierra y se ordenó sacerdote. A los 46 años volvió a Irlanda del Norte como obispo y misionero. Gracias al conocimiento del idioma y la cultura se dedicó a evangelizar a los líderes de las tribus, comenzando por la más influyente y poderosa: los taras. Pese a las amenazas contra su vida. continuó predicando el Evangelio, fundando conventos, monasterios, parroquias, además de cristianizar los ritos paganos, como el de la ceremonia del fuego, que fue conquistado con la celebración del fuego nuevo en la Vigilia Pascual, desafiando abiertamente la costumbre impuesta por los sacerdotes de la religión celta. Esto por poco le cuesta la vida, pero fue su victoria y con ella, la del cristianismo. El patrono de Irlanda es conocido también por el uso que hizo de la hoia de un trébol para explicar la Santísima Trinidad.
