GRACE AND HOPE

Which should we do? Turn our backs on our loved ones, or offer hospitality to all who come to us as Christ? Today we are told to do both, and yet there is no inherent contradiction here. Following Christ might mean that we need to be aware both that Christ comes first in our lives, and that losing our life for Christ's sake means to find it. We also are reminded that when we were baptized, we died with Christ, to sin and to the pull of the world, and live with him in a new life. No contradiction, no necessary confusion. Just grace and hope.

DYING AND RISING

The words of Saint Paul hit us smack in the face: "Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" (Romans 6:3). This epistle is one of the choices to be read at Catholic funerals. It generally comes as something of a shock to the listeners. But the reading goes on to offer great comfort to us as Christians. "[w]e have died with Christ . . . we shall also live with him . . . raised from the dead, [Christ] dies no more . . . [Christ] lives for God . . . you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus."

HOSPITALITY

One of the ways we live in God is to extend God's hospitality to all. As an old Irish rune says, "Often goes the Christ in the stranger's guise."

The woman of Shunem offered hospitality to the prophet Elisha in the form of dinner and a place to stay. He rewarded her hospitality with the promise of a son. Christ explains to us just what hospitality means: "Whoever receives you receives me" and shall not lack for a reward. As theologian Paul Wadell teaches, when we offer hospitality, we not only offer food and drink, or a place to stay, or other kindness, we offer ourselves; we offer our attention to a stranger's story, wherein we learn another person's perspective, and in doing so we listen to God's story.

In warning us that "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me . . ." and also, "Whoever finds [their] life will lose it, and whoever loses [their] life for my sake will find it" Jesus proposes that we cultivate detachment from things that we now consider primary in our lives. Christ loves us and wants us to put him first before other commitments or desires. Our hospitality to strangers puts Christ before ourselves in just this way.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

Guardian Angels School Receives \$40,000 Challenge Grant

Great News! The Richard Schulze Family Foundation has offered Guardian Angels School a \$20,000 challenge matching grant. This is a special effort that the foundation is making to help Catholic Schools during this extremely challenging time of the Coronavirus. Reading 1

2 Kgs 4:8–11, 14–16a

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, “I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there.” Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.

Later Elisha asked, “Can something be done for her?” His servant Gehazi answered, “Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years.” Elisha said, “Call her.” When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, “This time next year you will be fondling a baby son.”

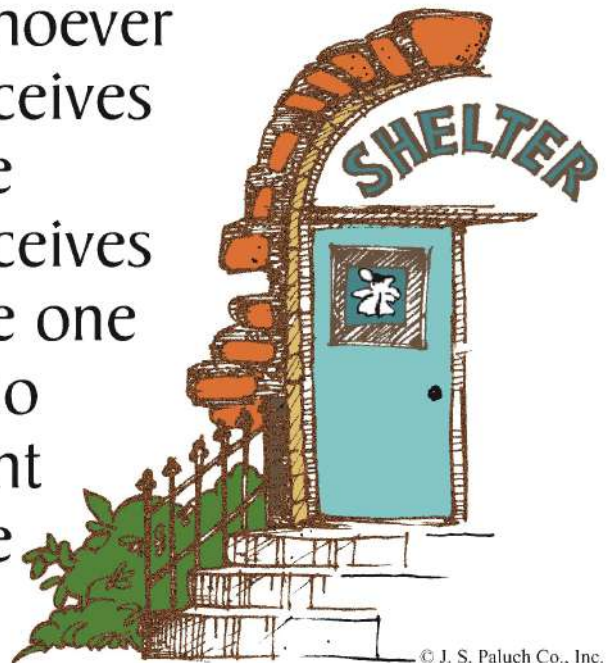
Mt 10:37–42

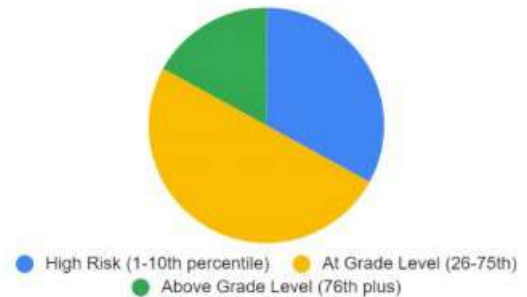

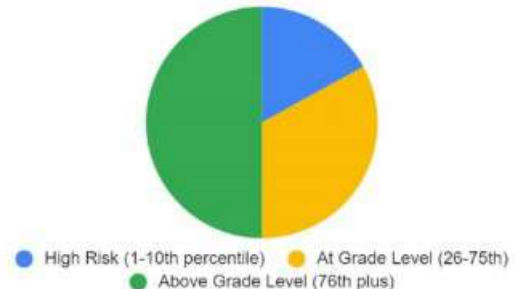


We are pleased to announce that Guardian Angels School was chosen to be a Believe and Read school! Powered by Catholic Schools Center of Excellence and Groves Academy, a national expert in reading instruction, and in partnership with Cretin-Derham Hall Catholic High School, Believe and Read is a new initiative that will transform literacy instruction at Guardian Angels. Believe and Read will not replace the existing literacy curriculum at our school. Rather, with the help of literacy coaches from Groves Academy, teachers will be tasked with incorporating a daily 30-minute phonics-based lesson to ensure our youngest students are grasping the reading rules they'll need to one day achieve fluency. By choosing Believe and Read, Guardian Angels will be able to maintain its individual identity and join a network of 19 other Catholic elementary schools in the Archdiocese with similar goals. Guardian Angels will also gain access to the special Believe and Read support and resources that CSCOE is providing. We are so pleased to share with you our results from the fall to winter results below:

“Emergency” Distance Learning

In March our teaching staff transitioned gracefully into “Emergency” Distance Learning. We are very proud of the work our students, parents and teachers have done during the past several months. Their dedication, perseverance and trust in God has been inspiring. Thanks to the grants from CSCOE, our teachers have been working with a technology coach for the past two years. Our teachers were able to begin teaching virtually using the skills they had learned.

We are already making plans for the 2020-2021 school year. The reopening of the school building will be guided by CDC, MN Department of Education in collaboration with the Archdiocese. The staff will be working on establishing clear guidelines and expectations for both the GA school staff, students and parents. Our plans will consist of three scenarios for the fall: Plan A - all students and staff are in the building, Plan B - some students and some staff are in the building while others are doing Distance Learning, and Plan C - all students and staff will be doing Distance Learning. These plans will cover everything from transportation, the entrance into the building, sanitation, health screenings, and instruction in and out of the classroom.

Our school was awarded the Plus 2 Grant - \$5000 giving us the opportunity to extend additional staff development and programming.

Development Team

This past year our development team worked with a development coach, Frank Donaldson from Institute for Parish and School Development. The purpose of this team is to engage parishioners and school families in the development of a Strategic Development Plan for the future of Guardian Angels School. This team will be working over the summer to bring everyone together to address several challenges that were identified in the parish/school survey.

GRACIA Y ESPERANZA

¿Qué debemos hacer? ¿Dar la espalda a nuestros seres queridos u ofrecer hospitalidad a todos los que vienen a nosotros como Cristo? Hoy se nos dice que hagamos ambas cosas, y sin embargo no hay ninguna contradicción inherente aquí. Seguir a Cristo podría significar que necesitamos ser conscientes tanto de que Cristo es lo primero en nuestra vida, como que perder nuestra vida por el bien de Cristo significa encontrarla. También se nos recuerda que cuando fuimos bautizados, morimos con Cristo, para al pecado y al tirón del mundo, y vivimos con él en una nueva vida. Sin contradicciones, sin confusión necesaria. Sólo gracia y esperanza.

MURIENDO Y RESUCITANDO

Las palabras de san Pablo son como una cachetada: “¿No saben ustedes que todos los que fuimos bautizados en Cristo Jesús, nos hemos sumergido en su muerte?” (Romanos 6:3). Esta carta de san Pablo es una de varias lecturas que se pueden escoger para que sea leída en los funerales, es una lectura que por lo general deja impresionados a quienes en esa circunstancia la escuchan. Aún en esta circunstancia, esta lectura nos da consuelo como cristianos, “hemos muerto con Cristo, creemos que también viviremos con él, . . . después de resucitar, no muere más, . . . vive para Dios. . . Así también ustedes, considérense muertos al pecado y vivos para Dios en Cristo Jesús.”

HOSPITALIDAD

Una de las formas que vivimos en Dios es compartir la hospitalidad de Dios a todos. Hay un dicho irlandés que dice “Cristo a menudo va disfrazado de desconocido”.

La mujer de Sunem ofreció su hospitalidad al profeta Eliseo invitándolo a comer y ofreciéndole un lugar donde descansar. Él agradeció y recompensó la hospitalidad con la promesa que tendría un hijo. Cristo nos explica lo que es la hospitalidad: “quien me recibe a mí, recibe al que me ha enviado” y no quedará sin recompensa. Así como el teólogo Paul Wadell nos enseña, cuando somos hospitalarios, no solamente ofrecemos agua y comida, o un lugar donde quedarse, u otro tipo de generosidad, nos ofrecemos nosotros mismos; ofrecemos nuestra atención a la historia de un desconocido, donde conocemos la perspectiva de otra persona y cuando esto pasa, escuchamos la historia de Dios.

Al advertirnos que “el que ama a su padre o a su madre más que a mí, no es digno de mí. . .” y también “el que salve su vida la perderá y el que la pierda por mí, la salvará” Jesús propone que aprendamos a desapegarnos de las cosas que ahora consideramos indispensables en nuestras vidas. Cristo nos ama y quiere que lo pongamos primero ante otros compromisos o deseos. Nuestra hospitalidad con personas desconocidas pone a Cristo ante nosotros solo de esta manera.
