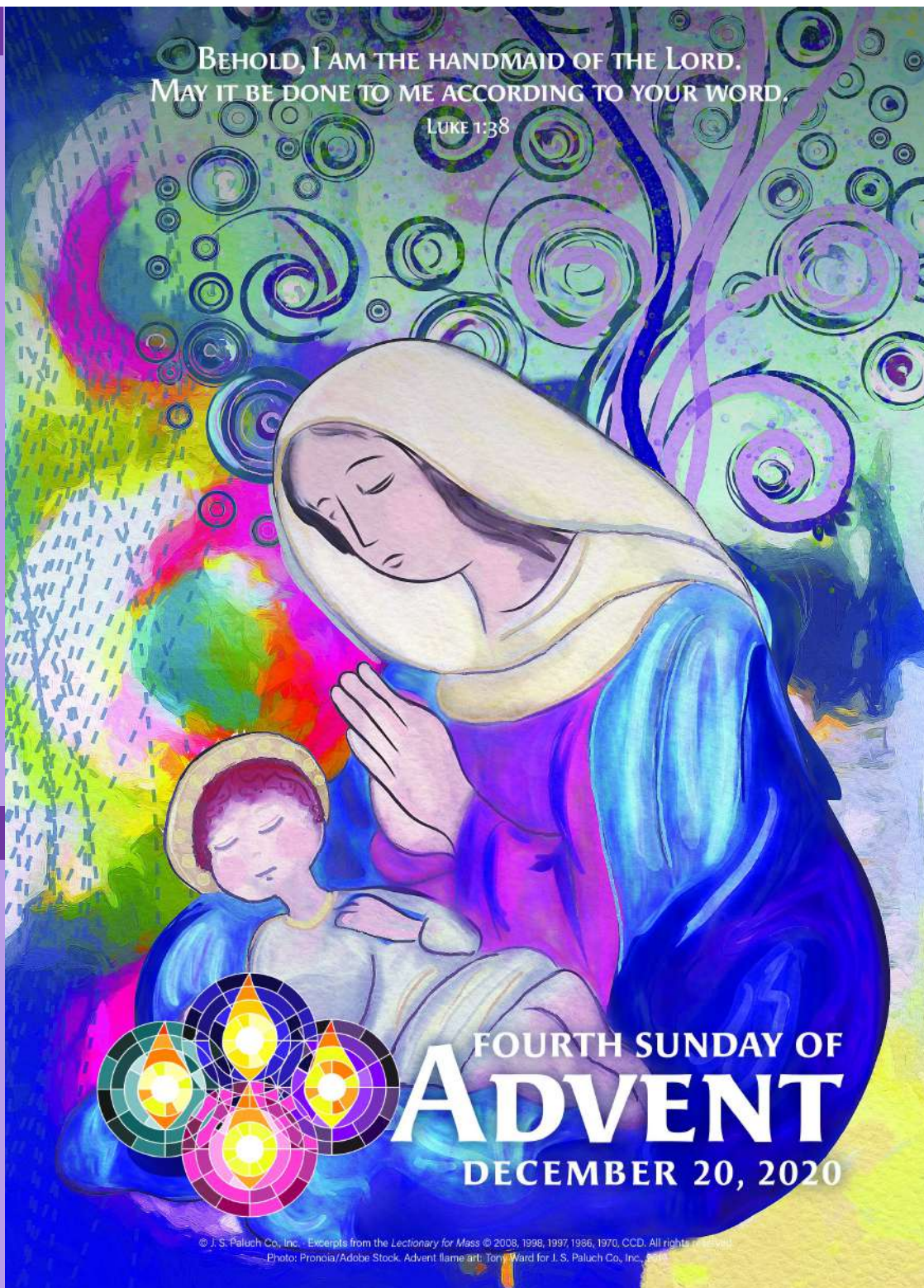

Mass Intentions: Mass intentions may be for the living and/or the departed, with a † designating in the bulletin a deceased person. There is a \$10 suggested donation per Mass intention. Permission from the sick person or his/her family must be granted before a name's inclusion in these prayers. To schedule a Mass intention, call the Parish Office.

Baptism: Sacramental preparation is required for all parents. Godparents and Grandparents are also encouraged to attend. Baptismal prep sessions are given every other month and Baptism Masses are held once a month. Call the Parish Office to schedule a child for Baptism and the parents for baptismal prep.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

FROM THE PASTOR

Gospel Reflection, 4th Sunday of Advent, Year B

How Can This Be?

The Gospel of the Annunciation is among the best known of all. The scene can be found in countless paintings. The Church of the Annunciation in Nazareth is beautiful and breathtaking when you consider that the angel Gabriel actually appeared to Mary there. But how do we know that it is really true that the angel announced to her that she would conceive a child who will be called “Son of the Most High”? The Gospel writer, Luke, himself says that he has followed all things closely.

But only one person could have been a reliable witness of these events: Mary herself. Only she knew that the child she had conceived, and to whom she had given birth, was not that of any man but had been given her in a marvelous way by God. Only she could talk about that with those who believed in their hearts that Jesus was really the Son of God.

We can imagine that there were many who mocked her and spread rumors that Mary’s child had not been begotten by Joseph, but rather someone else. Mary herself asks, “How can this be, since I have no husband?” And she receives the answer, “With God nothing will be impossible.” And then she experiences in her own body how what was humanly impossible is possible for God. When she brings the child Jesus into the world in poverty in Bethlehem, she firmly believes that in that silent, holy night she has given birth to the Savior, the Redeemer.

Those who believed her had similar experiences: the shepherds from the fields, the Wise Men who came from far off in the East, and later the many people who met Jesus, her son and who encountered his power to heal, his understanding, his love, and who for their own part came to believe and were able to say, “You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God.”

How about us? Are we able to say that with God all things are possible? Are we able to encounter Jesus in poverty, in the middle of rumors or in situations where we simply cannot see a way in which they will ever change? Jesus came into the world at Christmas. He comes to us today as a person like us. Let us celebrate this great event with gratitude and confidence.

And the angel said to her in reply, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. 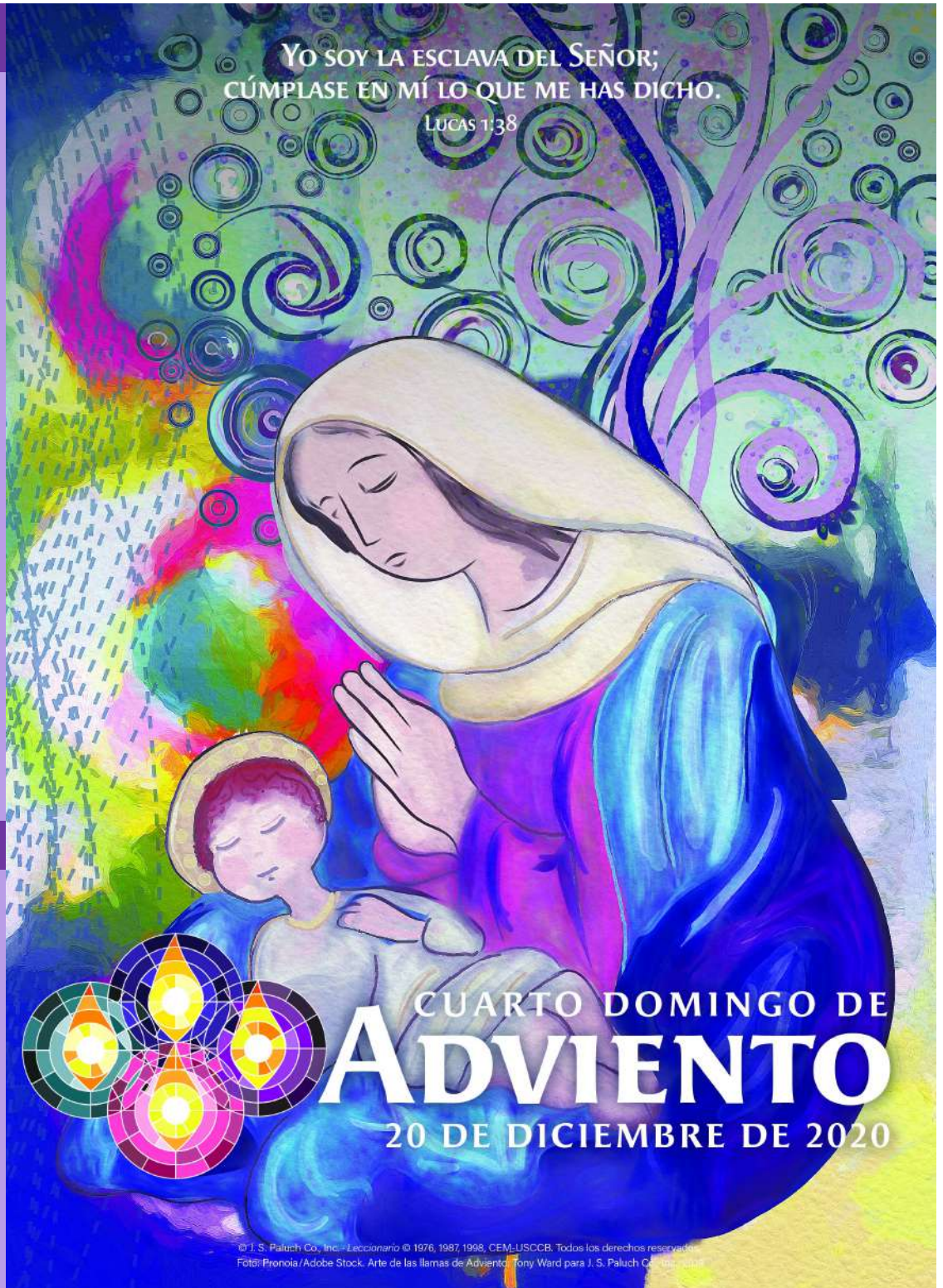
