

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

FROM THE PASTOR

Gospel Reflection, the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, Year A

What Will Become of the Child?

When we baptize a child a natural question is, "What will become of you? What will your life be like?" The Presentation of Jesus in the temple by his parents, Mary and Joseph, arouses similar feelings. Jesus is dedicated to God according to the law of Moses and it is a moving scene. The aged Simeon takes the child in his arms. He greets the newborn child with rejoicing over the budding of new life and a grateful farewell to his own life. His song of thanks – "lord, now let your servant depart in peace" – has therefore become the one, in the prayer of the Church, that is sung or prayed just before going to bed.

He recognizes in this little child of a poor family, the longed-for and promised Messiah of the Lord, who is to bring light and salvation to all peoples. The ancient widow Anna has a similar experience and recognizes how enormously important this child will be one day.

There is joy and farewell. And in this there is a solemn tone. Simeon sees that the child will one day be opposed. In the encounter with Jesus, one spirit will be distinguished from another. He will become a stumbling block for many and a sign of contradiction. For Mary, in all of this, a sword of sorrow will pierce her heart.

With these joyful and yet alarming reactions and their accompanying words in their hearts, Mary and Joseph return to Nazareth. Luke does not say anything about the Flight to Egypt. But with this time excepted, nothing too unusual happens. The Holy Family lives a quiet life with Joseph making a living as a carpenter and Mary working in the home.

What will become of Jesus? Mary carries in her heart what Simeon said about the child and her and she believes and trusts. It could not have been easy to know that something difficult was waiting for her and her Son. Yet she and Joseph were able to experience the joy of love for their Son and each other by their trust. This was true even when Jesus was lost in the temple for three days because in his words, "I must be about my Father's work". In even difficult moments such as this, Mary trusted, and in doing so, discovered new dimensions of her motherhood before God in her prayers. When she was standing beside the Cross and her son was dying in agony, she once more gave her assent, as she had before to the angel Gabriel and now she is Queen of Heaven and Earth.

May God bless you and your family this Christmas season!

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Gospel LK 2:22-40

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, They took him up to Jerusalem

to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death

before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to per-

form the custom of the law in regard to him,

He took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted —and you yourself a sword will pierce—so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four.

She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him. 

Simeón los bendijo, y a María, la madre de Jesús, le anunció: "Este niño ha sido puesto para ruina y resurgimiento de muchos en Israel, como signo que provocará contradicción, para que queden al descubierto los pensamientos de todos los corazones. Y a ti, una espada te atravesará el alma".

Había también una profetisa, Ana, hija de Fanuel, de la tribu de Aser. Era una mujer muy anciana. De joven, había vivido siete años casada y tenía ya ochenta y cuatro años de edad. No se apartaba del templo ni de día ni de noche, sirviendo a Dios con ayunos y oraciones. Ana se acercó en aquel momento, dando gracias a Dios y hablando del niño a todos los que aguardaban la liberación de Israel.

Y cuando cumplieron todo lo que prescribía la ley del Señor, se volvieron a Galilea, a su ciudad de Nazaret. El niño iba creciendo y fortaleciéndose, se llenaba de sabiduría y la gracia de Dios estaba con él.
