



FROM THE PASTOR



Congratulations First Communicants!

Today we welcome our youngest and newest members of our faith to the table of the Lord, to receive His body and blood, soul and divinity. I wish each family with a first communicant a beautiful day with your families and God's blessings as you celebrate this great day together. Back in my day, I wore an orange dress shirt with a white tie and plaid pants. It was the mid 1970's. Things were different back then. But in any case I remember the buzz of excitement around our classroom as we met that morning in our class at Nativity of Mary in Bloomington. We can learn much from the enthusiasm of our young members of our faith, who are thinking about Jesus who comes to meet us in this marvelous way.

Jesus says, "I am the vine and you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in Him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." (John 15:5)

So he gives us the image of a vineyard that tells us that we are dead without God. For God is the life of our life. And since he is the God of life, he does not wish for us to die; rather he wishes for us to live. If we do not have a real, living contact with Jesus, the Son of God, then we are quite as dead as vine branches lying on the ground. Our real living contact with Him is He, Himself. We remember Him not merely in history, but in our lives here and now by coming to church to receive Him as a perpetual sacrifice given up for us, first given on the cross. This is worth celebrating, worth contemplating, and worth getting up on a Sunday for, so that we can come to meet our Savior.

Jesus shares with us also the image of pruning. God brings us to become alive again, like a vinedress-er carefully pruning our dead branches, so that miraculously, from the stump of the vine, a new shoot can spring forth. We can think of the entire Church in this way. In the bible, the vineyard is often an image for the people of God. Sometimes it seems cut back so much that many people declare it to be already dead. Yet it then shoots forth again, as a new and living growth. This is what we can see in history right up to this day. Let us pray for a new springtime in the Church!

Many of the cuts hurt – tribulations that God allows to come on us to cleanse us. But God, the vine-dresser knows what are unfruitful shoots for us and what wrong inclinations and self-deceptions have to be gotten rid of.

Jesus is the true vine, in whom the life-giving sap of God is flowing. Nothing works without him. "Abide in me!" he says. It is not the person who utters many words who is abiding in Christ but the one who loves his neighbor. That is the fruit that God expects from us, the only really good fruit. For without love, we are nothing but dead branches. May we all be able to recognize a community who loves God and abides in Him! God bless you all!

Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches.

Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned.

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified,

that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."


