Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least eight months in advance.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

From The Pastor

Thanks for Coming to the Town Hall Meeting!

Dear Parishioners,

I want to thank all who came to the town hall meeting on June 29th. Special thanks also to Brad, Barb, and Steve Gestach and the rest of the Parish Pastoral Council for cooking up our dinner and bringing other food items. I want to recap some financials at this important time of wrapping up the last fiscal year and beginning a new one. So, let's wrap up our capital campaign, PAVE THE WAY:

Amount Actually Received to 6/1/21:	\$1,076,341.88
Amount paid as debt to the Archdiocese:	\$200,628.87
Amount paid to our loan from CFC Corp.:	\$676,292.95
Interest, campaign consultant, fees, deferred maintenance:	\$199,420.06
Remaining loan balance yet to be paid:	\$59,711.71

Thank you so much for all of your contributions to our three-year capital campaign!

How did things go with our operating income and expenses this year? We, unfortunately needed to spend \$75,000 in June 2021 from our line of credit with Charter Bank. Again, we have previously spent \$50,000 from our line of credit in June 2019. Therefore:

Together, with the remaining CFC loan balance, our current debt total is \$184,711.71 as of June 1st, 2021.

We will continue to provide one envelope per month and an on-line giving option to continue to pay down our debt. Please be as generous as you can so that we can pay off our debt. Thanks!

Now let's talk about our operating budget for next year:

Last year budgeted income:	\$617,500
Next year budgeted income:	\$632,370

With the unfortunate closure of the school, we fully expect to have a balanced budget this coming fiscal year beginning July 1st, 2021. With the pandemic subsiding, we have increased our expected income slightly. However, our budget is tight and your planned, proportionate and prayerful giving will help us to meet the staffing and operational needs of our parish.

Finally, let's talk about our maintenance fund that we started last October:

Amount Collected October 1 – June 1: \$34,693.26

We propose replacing the friary roof this autumn with TJ Exteriors for slightly less than \$70,000. We believe that the friary has great potential to be renovated as a future parish center and that it needs to be protected as an asset that will benefit Guardian Angels. This year, we must determine our needs for parish-use space and create drawings for a new parish center.

How can you help? Let's increase slightly our regular Sunday giving, build our maintenance fund, and continue, as you can, to pay down our debt. Thanks so much for your good stewardship!


