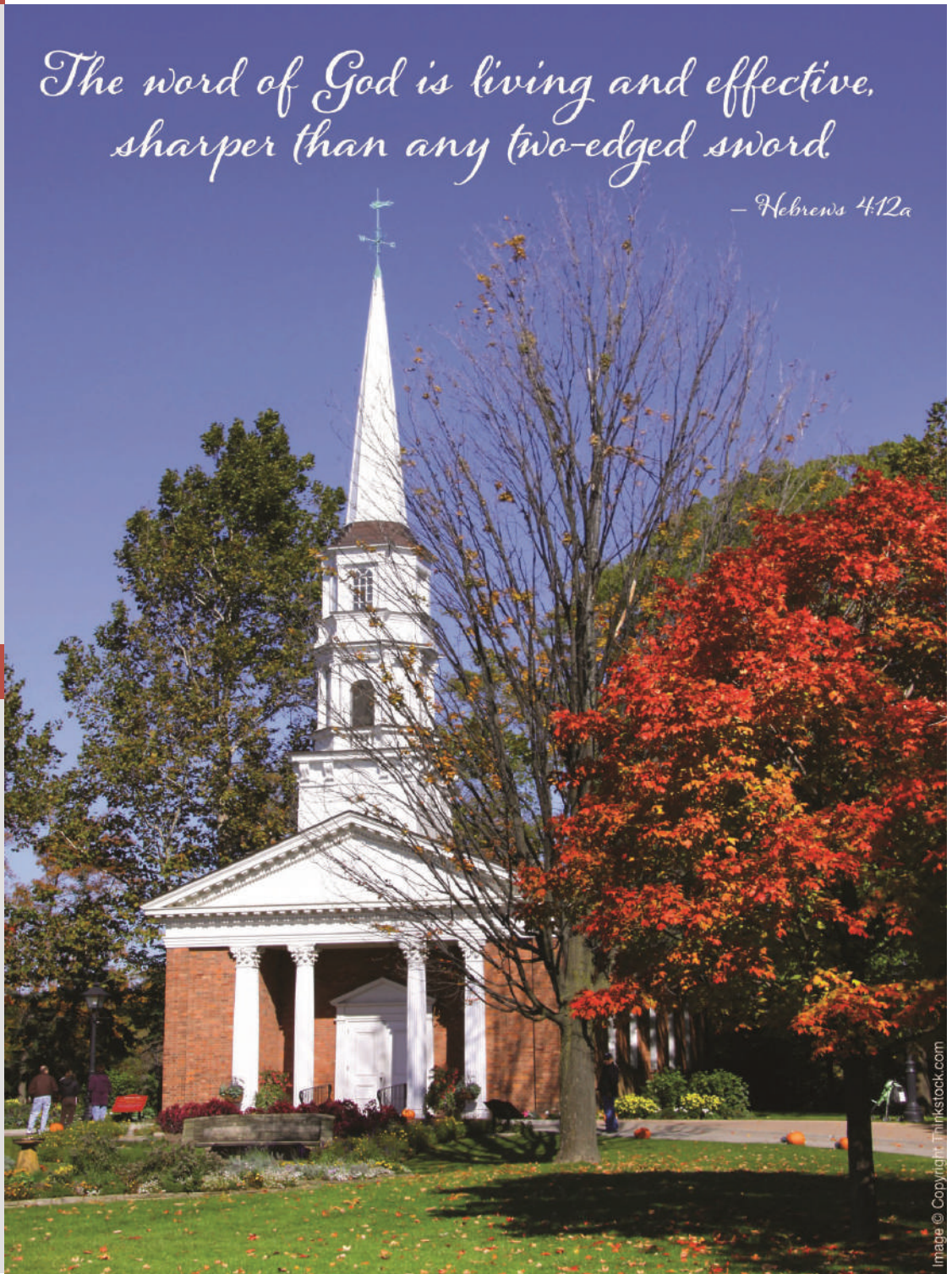

We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

From The Pastor

The Camel and the Eye of the Needle

“What must I do to achieve eternal life?” This was the rich man’s question and Jesus was not particularly pleased with it. One would think that he would be. Today, we often seem to avoid the questions: “How can I succeed in life? How can I be happy here and now? How can I attain financial security?” These questions are often asked, but we put off until later these ultimate questions, pushing them to the sidelines of our minds altogether.

But Jesus’ answer is brusque and brief: “Why call me good? Only God is good!” He refuses to accept the rich man’s expression of respect in calling him “good master.” It is as if to say, “Don’t look for a master who might be able to show you special or secret ways to achieve eternal happiness.” God has already shown the way in centuries past. You need only keep the Ten Commandments. They are simple and yet we know in our hearts that keeping them will lead to happiness and a growing communion with God.

The rich man has been trying to keep them from his youth and explains this to Jesus. Now, Jesus is moved and looks at him lovingly and invites him to take one more step that is still lacking. “Let go! Let go of your riches, give everything to the poor, and come with me!” he might have said. But the rich man cannot bring himself to take this step.

We should appreciate what Jesus says next as a reversal of how we often think. We think that anyone who wins millions in a lottery must be happy. The one who has had career success and can have anything he wants is admired and envied. But for Jesus, it is the opposite. Just as a camel cannot pass through the eye of a needle, so a rich man cannot possibly get into heaven.

The disciples are horrified at hearing this. Jesus does not let up in his teaching. One cannot get through the gate of death with an enormous baggage of wealth. You have to let go of everything. You can take nothing with you except the good you have done in your lifetime. This is why Jesus advises the rich man to let go of everything now and not wait until death, when it will be too late. Is it possible to let go so completely? “Yes”, replies Jesus to the disciples, “It is possible with God.”

Faith Formation

We have been extraordinarily blessed this year with 120+ youth in our program – that's over 50% more youth than last year! That means that we need the support of our GA community more now than ever. There are many ways for YOU to share the joy of our bustling hallways and smiling faces. In order to ensure that we meet all Archdiocesan Child Safety guidelines, we have increased the number of adults needed to teach and share the gift of faith.

Our #1 priority? Two additional catechists and 3-4 classroom assistants would give us the ideal number of adults! Can you help us meet this need? If you are not available every Wednesday but would love the chance to teach – consider being a co-catechist or substitute catechist and share the planning with someone else.

We are also in great need of childcare volunteers to care for toddlers (age 2-5) so that their parents can either teach Faith Formation or attend weekly Encounter groups.

We need adults of all ages and experiences to take a leadership role in the Youth Ministry Core Team by helping to plan and implement youth events centered around community building.



El Señor de los Milagros

Hoy nuestros hermanos Peruanos celebran en Angeles Guardianas al Señor de los Milagros. Bienvenidos!

El Señor de los Milagros, Cristo de Pachacamilla, Cristo Morado, Cristo de las Maravillas, Cristo Moreno o Señor de los Temblores es una imagen del Señor Jesús pintada milagrosamente en una pared de adobe ubicada en el Altar Mayor del Santuario de Las Nazarenas de Lima (Perú).

A mediados del siglo XVII los negros de Angola formaron la cofradía de Pachacamilla y levantaron una edificación en donde uno de ellos pintó en la pared la preciosa imagen de Cristo.

El 13 de noviembre de 1655 un fuerte terremoto sacudió a Lima y Callao haciendo caer muchos edificios y causando miles de muertos. Todas las paredes de la Cofradía de los angoleños se cayeron, pero el muro de adobe con la imagen del Cristo permaneció en pie perfectamente, lo que fue considerado un verdadero milagro.

Cada año aumentó la fe al que llamaron Señor de los Milagros y hoy en día su procesión por las calles de Lima en el mes de octubre congrega a millones de personas de diferentes partes del mundo.

Comunión en la mano

El recibir el Cuerpo de Cristo en la mano no siempre nos es fácil, de hecho a veces nos causa problemas. Quizá porque consideramos que no somos dignos de recibir la divinidad de Cristo, de tener en ella a Dios mismo hecho pan. Si siguiéramos este argumento al pie de la letra habría que cuestionarse respecto a qué parte de nuestro cuerpo está limpia de pecado para con ella recibir al Señor. La respuesta es lógica. No implica ninguna falta de respeto a la divinidad de Cristo, a su cuerpo, el recibirlo en la mano. Es más bien la gratitud ante un Dios que, a pesar de que no nos queremos lo suficiente como para considerarnos dignos de tenerlo en nuestra mano, no sólo se nos da en la mano, sino que lo comulgamos. Eso habla de cómo es Dios, de lo que es él. Además, esta tradición de comunión en la mano, data desde el año 386 y san Cirilo, obispo de Jerusalén hablaba ya de ella en sus catequesis mistagógicas. El recibir la comunión en la mano, no es cuestión de indignidad o falta de respeto, es también una forma de tomar la responsabilidad propia de vivir conforme a lo que recibimos.
