This Mirror

Pilate asks Jesus the question, "Are you the king of the Jews?". Jesus did not answer it with a description of power, at least according to the world's standards. And he stood before him powerless and having been scourged and in shackles. He was a prisoner with no army behind him and no financial backing. By human standards he ought to have been long forgotten and swallowed up in the broad stream of history.

But he is still there, standing before the powerful people of this world. Each of us has some desire for the world's power, either at home or at work, or in front of our colleagues, or amongst friends. It is interesting how Jesus responds at first to Pilate. He says, "Do you say this of your own accord or did others say it about me?" It is as if he is holding a mirror up to Pilate and asking, Are you saying it because that is the general opinion or because you really want to know for yourself? Are you under pressure in saying it or does this come from your heart?

If we look in Jesus' mirror, we can ask ourselves, "How many of my views are mere prejudices? How much of what I think and say is simply taken over from other people without asking myself whether I really think it myself?"

Pilate is not prepared for this question. Jesus says simply that his kingdom is not of this world. If it were, then his followers would fight on his behalf. He says that he came to bear witness to the truth: "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I have come into the world, to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears my voice."

All earthly power is limited, but anyone who accepts Christ as his king cannot be dominated by such power. Christ will liberate us. The King who stands before Pilate in chains sets people free from all the bonds of self-deception and lies. We only need to respond to the truth and to look in this mirror to see if we are conforming to this great truth that Jesus Christ is our King! Father Tony




