**Communion for the Homebound:** When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Dear Friend in Christ,

Human beings cannot live without hope. Unlike animals, we are blessed with the ability to think about the future and to have something to look forward to. This is so essential to human life and without hope, we would surrender to despair. We hope for a better life for our children and that they might be saved from the mistakes we have made. We hope for a better and more peaceful world. We hope for a job offer, a bed in a homeless shelter, and a good result from our physician's test. These are good things to hope for and this hope gives dignity and purpose to our lives.

But in hearing our scripture readings this Advent, we learn what to hope for, ultimately. The people of the Old Testament had the courage to hope for big things: that the desert would be turned into fertile land; that the blind would see, the deaf hear and the lame walk; that their scattered and divided people would eventually be gathered again and united in the blessings of everlasting peace.

We hope for the same things as they did. But we differ from them in that the coming of Jesus in history partially fulfills God's promises and immeasurably strengthens and confirms our hope. Second, Jesus has revealed to us that God is not far off, but is already in our midst. John the Baptist and Mary, who we hear a lot from in the liturgy recognized the new situation and serve as role models of hope and of discerning the presence of our Savior in the world. Now, this Advent, we follow them by daring to rekindle our hope for big things once again. Come to Mass this Advent and Christmas season and beyond to meet the one who truly fulfills our hope. May God bless you this Advent and Christmas!

In 1531, Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared to a young peasant named Juan Diego to plea with the Bishop to build a shrine in her name. Though the bishop refused twice, Mary provided Castilian roses in the middle of December for Juan Diego to take to the bishop as a sign. When Juan Diego opened his tilma, the roses along with the bishop fell to the floor because the image of Our Lady had miraculously appeared on the cloak. Our Lady of Guadalupe is called the Patroness of the Americas because she brought together the native people of Mexico and the Spanish imperialists who governed the area. Throughout history, Our Lady of Guadalupe has been a symbol of unity of people across borders and cultures for the glory of God.


