Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.



THE PRODIGAL SON AND THE FORGIVING FATHER

Few gospel readings capture our attention and imagination more than the story of the Prodigal Son. Some even say it is the greatest story ever told. Of course, it was told by Jesus. Who is not moved by seeing this father, who is waiting with yearning for his son, and who sees him when he is still a long way off, when he finally comes home? There is no word of reproach, no "Why did you do it?" but only a simple joy over the son who has given him so much trouble and who has now come back again.

Artists have captured this moment of the father's moving mercy and the son's peace that he longs for. I recall the famous painting of Rembrandt on the cover of Father Henri Nouwen's book, <u>The Return of the Prodigal Son</u>. This is what lay close to Jesus' heart! The younger son demands his inheritance – a great insult to the Father. But then after a long time and great self-inflicted pain in squandering his days in dissolute living, he comes to his senses. He comes back without much expectation not expecting to even be treated like a son, but as one of his father's hired hands.

But the father wants to welcome his son and only wants communion with him again. This is all that matters to the Father. A restored father-son relationship means everything to him. He treats his son as a son with great joy and jubilation.

Who in your life do you need to forgive? How do you need to be forgiven and come back? Take the time to come to our penance service this Sunday, March 27th at 4:00 PM. A few of my brother priests will be there. Take some time this week to reflect on this, the greatest story ever told. God bless you all.

Pero el padre quiere acoger a su hijo y sólo quiere volver a comulgar con él. Esto es todo lo que le importa al Padre. Una relación padre-hijo restaurada significa todo para él. Trata a su hijo como a un hijo con gran alegría y júbilo. ¿A quién en tu vida necesitas perdonar? ¿Cómo necesitas ser perdonado y volver? Tómese el tiempo para venir a nuestro servicio de penitencia este domingo 27 de marzo a las 4:00 p.m. Algunos de mis hermanos sacerdotes estarán allí. Tómese un tiempo esta semana para reflexionar sobre esta, la mejor historia jamás contada. Dios los bendiga a todos.

Today, the Fourth Sunday of Lent, we celebrate **Laetare Sunday**.

Laetare is a Latin word that means "rejoice." You may notice that Father Tony is wearing rose colored vestments - rose, not pink. It's a subtle difference but an important one.

If you think back to the third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday), and remember that priests wore rose colored vestments and lit the rose colored candle, you see that priests are again wearing their rose colored chasubles today. Why?

Well, the change from violet to rose is meant to mark a shift in our celebration of Lent. Today is a day to rejoice even as we make our Lenten sacrifices. It is a short break from the somberness of penance symbolized by the color violet.

Laetare Sunday is the half-way point... It is celebrated 21 days before Easter Sunday. On this day we are encouraged and reminded that through our sacrifice we will soon taste great joy. After Jesus Christ's Passion & Death on the Cross comes the joy of Resurrection! So, rejoice now in your sorrow. (based on J Dees)
