THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Today in our gospel on this Trinity Sunday, we hear Jesus say in John's gospel to his disciples, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth." Was Jesus' message just one stage, or was it the climax and conclusion of what God has to say to the world? Has Jesus already said all that there is to say?

In truth, God never stops communicating with his people. God communicates his love shared among his three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The life and love of the Trinity extends into our life. We are brought into the life of the Trinity at our Baptism and this life is strengthened in the gift of Confirmation. God gives and gives and gives to us with the great desire that we repent, throw aside our selfish ways, and follow him. God so badly wants us to share his life.

Jesus says just prior to this passage during the Last Supper, "I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you" (John 15:15). So he really did bring the whole of the Father's message. He is the beloved Son in whose person God has made his greatest gift to the world. Only we are too small to be able to grasp it in its entirety right away. Our hearts are not yet large enough to accept the whole of his gift. Yet, every time we make the sign of the cross and pray, we invite him into our lives more and more.

That is why Jesus promised that he would send us his Spirit, to lead us, step by step, deeper and deeper into the truth. Bit by bit, the Holy Spirit makes our hearts bigger and more spacious, so that we may gradually perceive what Jesus means for us. God's method in doing this is not by using force, but by patiently guiding and leading us on, drawing us more and more into his life. One day, perhaps not until the Last Day, we will see how very much God truly loves us.

May God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit bless you all!

LA SANTÍSIMA TRINIDAD

Hoy en nuestro evangelio en este Domingo de la Trinidad, escuchamos a Jesús decir en el evangelio de Juan a sus discípulos: "Tengo mucho más que decirles, pero ahora no pueden soportarlo. Pero cuando venga, el Espíritu de verdad, él os guiará a toda la verdad". ¿Fue el mensaje de Jesús solo una etapa, o fue el clímax y la conclusión de lo que Dios tiene que decirle al mundo? ¿Jesús ya ha dicho todo lo que hay que decir? En verdad, Dios nunca deja de comunicarse con su pueblo. Dios comunica su amor compartido entre sus tres personas, Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. La vida y el amor de la Trinidad se extienden a nuestra vida. Somos llevados a la vida de la Trinidad en nuestro Bautismo y esta vida se fortalece en el don de la Confirmación. Dios da y da y nos da con el gran deseo de que nos arrepintamos, dejemos de lado nuestros caminos egoístas y lo sigamos. Dios desea tanto que compartamos su vida. Jesús dice justo antes de este pasaje durante la Última Cena: "Os he llamado amigos, porque todo lo que he oído de mi Padre os lo he dado a conocer" (Juan 15:15). Así que realmente trajo todo el mensaje del Padre. Él es el Hijo amado en cuya persona Dios ha hecho su mayor don al mundo. Solo que somos demasiado pequeños para poder captarlo en su totalidad de inmediato. Nuestros corazones aún no son lo suficientemente grandes para aceptar la totalidad de su don. Sin embargo, cada vez que hacemos la señal de la cruz y oramos, lo invitamos cada vez más a nuestra vida. Por eso Jesús prometió que nos enviaría su Espíritu, para guiarnos, paso a paso, más y más profundamente en la verdad. Poco a poco, el Espíritu Santo hace más grande y más espacioso nuestro corazón, para que podamos ir percibiendo poco a poco lo que Jesús significa para nosotros. El método de Dios para hacer esto no es usando la fuerza, sino guiándonos y conduciéndonos con paciencia, atrayéndonos más y más a su vida. Un día, tal vez no hasta el último día, veremos cuánto nos ama Dios verdaderamente. ¡Que Dios Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo los bendiga a todos!

Baptism: Our Baptism Belonging Class is required for all parents as a first step to Baptism of your child. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 to sign up for a class. We encourage Godparents to attend. Baptisms are scheduled once per month after the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass. Special dates requested for Baptism will be considered and accommodated depending on circumstances.

Reconciliation: Saturdays at GA from 8:00 - 8:45 a.m. and 3:15 - 4:15 p.m. or by appt.

Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least 8 months in advance.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

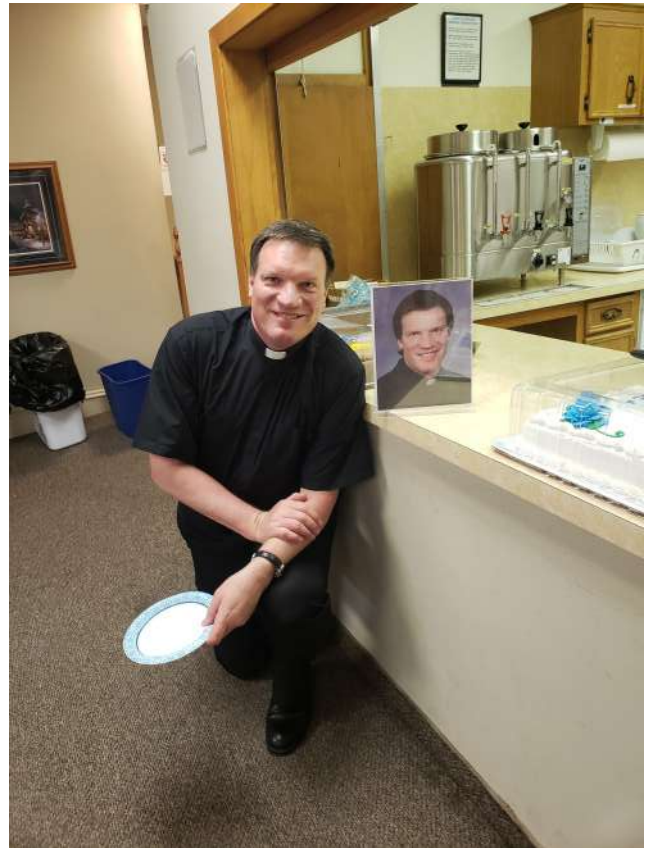

The Ecuadorian celebration of Our Lady of Nube was held on Sunday, May 29th at the St. Nicholas Prayer Garden. It began with the Spanish Mass at Guardian Angels in Chaska. A procession was formed walking three miles to St. Nick’s in Carver. The feast day of this apparition is January 7th, but this is difficult to celebrate in the Minnesota winter. Approximately two hundred people participated honoring The Blessed Virgin. Our Lady of Nube means “Woman in the Cloud”. She appeared to the faithful who were praying for the healing of their Bishop, as he was gravely ill and there were few priests in the province to say Mass. On January 7th, in the town of Quito, Ecuador, the Blessed Virgin appeared in a cloud above the church for all to see and the Bishop was healed.

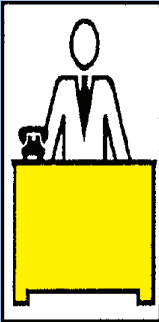
