LIKE LAMBS AMONG WOLVES

Once when I was hiking in the Rocky Mountains with some friends, we decided to plan for an overnight hike. Everything we had was on our backs, so every last detail had to be planned in such a way that we were very efficient. We could not afford to carry any excess weight. Even our sleeping bags were the size of a grapefruit, with the air being let out of them.

Jesus sends the Apostles and 72 out in pairs to every town so that they could tell them that the kingdom of God was at hand. He says, "Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way." What does this mean for us? Certainly we can see the advantages of packing light and how that enables us to go freely. But there is more.

Jesus gave them very clear rules for the mission. Wherever missionaries have remained faithful, keeping to Jesus direction a blessing has eventually come from it. When they have not, then they have introduced distortion or triviality to their message and witness. Today, we need a bold witness to the gospel that is refreshing and authentic. Even so, Jesus wants us to be like lambs among wolves with great respect for people's consciences and freedom. Jesus himself lived as a poor man and trusted in God's providence.

Now we live in a post-Roe vs. Wade time. But it is also a time in which the world listens to witnesses more than teachers. Keep speaking for life! But keep witnessing by being a community caring for life. Keep witnessing by responding to the needs of our local pregnancy resource centers. This is one of the finest examples of an American solution to a huge problem in American history. These centers help young mothers and fathers deal with what is often trauma that leads them to the decisions that they have made. This is what the leaders of these centers tell me. Be bold. Take action that affects our local area. You can make a difference. Give witness to His love, compassion and mercy so that abortion becomes unthinkable in our land!

COMO CORDEROS ENTRE LOBOS

Una vez, cuando estaba de excursión en las Montañas Rocosas con algunos amigos, decidimos planificar una caminata nocturna. Todo lo que teníamos estaba sobre nuestras espaldas, por lo que había que planificar hasta el último detalle de tal manera que fuéramos muy eficientes. No podíamos darnos el lujo de llevar exceso de peso. Incluso nuestros sacos de dormir eran del tamaño de una toronja, con el aire saliendo de ellos. Jesús envía a los Apóstoles y 72 en parejas a cada pueblo para que les avisen que el reino de Dios está cerca. Él dice: "Sigue tu camino; he aquí, os envío como corderos en medio de lobos. No lleven alforja, ni alforja, ni sandalias; y a nadie saludéis por el camino. ¿Qué significa esto para nosotros? Ciertamente podemos ver las ventajas de empacar liviano y cómo eso nos permite viajar libremente. Pero hay más Jesús les dio reglas muy claras para la misión. Dondequiera que los misioneros han permanecido fieles, manteniendo la dirección de Jesús, eventualmente ha venido una bendición. Cuando no lo han hecho, han introducido distorsión o trivialidad en su mensaje y testimonio. Hoy, necesitamos un testimonio audaz del evangelio que sea refrescante y auténtico. Aun así, Jesús quiere que seamos como corderos entre lobos con gran respeto por la conciencia y la libertad de las personas. Jesús mismo vivió como un hombre pobre y confió en la providencia de Dios. Ahora vivimos en una época posterior a Roe vs. Wade. Pero también es un tiempo en el que el mundo escucha más a testigos que a maestros. ¡Sigue hablando por la vida! Pero sigan testimoniando siendo una comunidad que se preocupa por la vida. Siga testificando respondiendo a las necesidades de nuestros centros locales de recursos para el embarazo. Este es uno de los mejores ejemplos de una solución estadounidense a un gran problema en la historia de Estados Unidos. Estos centros ayudan a las madres y padres jóvenes a lidiar con lo que a menudo es un trauma que los lleva a las decisiones que han tomado. Esto es lo que me dicen los líderes de estos centros. Sé audaz. Tomar medidas que afecten a nuestra área local. Tu puedes hacer la diferencia. ¡Dar testimonio de Su amor, compasión y misericordia para que el aborto sea impensable en nuestra tierra!


