Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony Vanderloop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least 8 months in advance.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

GOSPEL HOSPITALITY

Jesus was invited to the banquet of a ruler who belonged to a Pharisee. We can only imagine how they watched him, how they mistrusted him, and tried to find reason for their mistrust. In the meantime, they chose the places of honor at the banquet. Jesus, on the other hand, was one to choose the table not just with Pharisees, but with prostitutes and tax collectors as well. He sees through the daily games of vanity and pompousness. He says to choose the lowest place. What are the fears of being at this lowest place? Will I be ignored or overlooked by the guests of honor? Will I get stuck there? Will I be angry about it? Or will I have honestly chosen a low place? Will I

have truly understood in my heart that what matters is how I stand before God and not whether other people assign me a place of honor? As we welcome many to our upcoming festival and start up many of our activities again, our hearts should be moved to openness to those whom we don't really know. This is part of what it means to let go of the honored place, the familiar place, and the comfortable place. Take some time to talk with those you really don't know!

The banquet in the gospel is an anticipation of the heavenly feast. How we will be astonished when – let us hope – we one day get to take part in the heavenly banquet. Who will take the places of honor there? Perhaps it will be people who were regarded as “of little account” by other people but who had a great heart.

And Jesus goes on to make a second observation. There is so much calculation among you! “You invited me, so I will invite you.” No, you should invite the very people who cannot give you anything in return. That is exactly what God does with us! We have no way to repay him. Nevertheless, he invites us every Sunday as his guests. Let us be a welcoming church the way God welcomes us!

Él dice que elija el lugar más bajo. ¿Cuáles son los miedos de estar en este lugar más bajo? ¿Seré ignorado o pasado por alto por los invitados de honor? ¿Me quedará atrapado allí? ¿Estaré enojado por eso? ¿O habré elegido honestamente un lugar bajo? ¿Habré entendido verdaderamente en mi corazón que lo que importa es cómo estoy ante Dios y no si los demás me asignan un lugar de honor? A medida que damos la bienvenida a muchos a nuestro próximo festival y comenzamos muchas de nuestras actividades nuevamente, nuestros corazones deben moverse para abrirse a aquellos a quienes realmente no conocemos. Esto es parte de lo que significa dejar ir el lugar de honor, el lugar familiar y el lugar cómodo. ¡Tómame un tiempo para hablar con aquellos que realmente no conoces! El banquete en el evangelio es una anticipación de la fiesta celestial. Cómo nos asombraremos cuando, esperemos, podamos un día participar en el banquete celestial. ¿Quién ocupará los lugares de honor allí? Tal vez serán personas que fueron consideradas como "de poca importancia" por otras personas pero que tenían un gran corazón. Y Jesús pasa a hacer una segunda observación. ¡Hay tanto cálculo entre vosotros! "Tú me invitaste, así que te invitaré". No, debes invitar a las mismas personas que no pueden darte nada a cambio. ¡Eso es exactamente lo que Dios hace con nosotros! No tenemos forma de pagarle. Sin embargo, nos invita todos los domingos como sus huéspedes. ¡Seamos una iglesia acogedora como Dios nos acoge!

We will be acknowledging Father Devorak's 50th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood at Saint Nicholas in Carver at the 10:00 Mass on Sunday, August 28th with a reception after Mass at the Saint Nicholas Parish Center. We invite you to come and celebrate with him!

Fr. Jim was born in Canby, MN, and grew up in Madison, MN. He was ordained August 27th, 1972 for the Diocese of New Ulm at St. Michael in Madison by Bishop Alphonse J. Schladweiler. Following ordination his parish assignments included: Holy Redeemer in Marshall, Holy Rosary in North Mankato, Holy Rosary in Graceville, St. Barnabas in Barry, St. George in Glencoe, St. Andrew in Fairfax, St. Dionysius in Tyler, St. Genevieve in Lake Benton, St. Pius X in Glencoe, St. Anastasia in Hutchinson, St. Boniface in Stewart, St. Joseph in Montevideo, St. Andrew in Granite Falls, St. Clara in Clara City, St. John in Darwin and assisting in the Seeker of Souls Area Faith Community, St. Gertrude in Forest City, St. Mary in Willmar and assisting in the Jesus Our Living Waters Area Faith Community, St. Patrick in Kandiyohi, St. Thomas More in Lake Lillian, Our Lady of the Lakes in Spicer, St. John in Ortonville, and St. Joseph in Rosen.

On June 30th, 2021 Fr. Jim retired from active ministry in the Archdiocese. He currently lives in Jordan at the edge of town at 940 Broadway St. S. 
