Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

THE REAL LOVE OF CHRIST

Can we both love and hate at the same time? Our 4th commandment says that we should love and honor our parents. Human nature teaches us that we should love our wives, our husbands and our children. Hatred between our brothers and sisters certainly does not correspond to God's will. And yet Jesus tells us that we have to "hate" our father, mother, wife, and children, brothers and sisters if we want to be his disciples.

What is Jesus trying to say? He is not preaching hatred, but rather that we are supposed to love our families but not to make a god or an idol out of them. God comes before our own families, our parents, our spouses and our children, and indeed ourselves. I am not the ultimate standard, and the wishes and interest of the family are not the highest values there are.

Sometimes this truth is experienced painfully. A young man or a young woman experiences a call to become a priest or a religious sister and the parents do not support this. A spouse in a marriage wonders what is going on when God obviously takes first place for his or her spouse. A friend is taken aback when another friend turns down an activity he proposes because it would take them away from God. For the person trying to follow Jesus, the situation may become a real cross. Maybe this is why Jesus uses such a harsh word here.

But more often, it is a challenge to allow God to govern our lives even when there is no family member to oppose us, but rather the many things of this world that clamor for our attention. Saint Teresa of Calcutta whose day of death and maybe soon-to-be feast day is September 5th, offered us a beautiful witness of offering everything, of leaving home and family, of making the meaning of her life to be the person of Jesus Christ. In serving the poorest of the poor, she teaches us what union with God means. Saint Teresa of Calcutta, pray for us that we may be able to leave everything to follow our Lord as you did!

¿Podemos amar y odiar al mismo tiempo? Nuestro cuarto mandamiento dice que debemos amar y honrar a nuestros padres. La naturaleza humana nos enseña que debemos amar a nuestras esposas, a nuestros maridos y nuestros hijos. El odio entre nuestros hermanos y hermanas ciertamente no corresponder a la voluntad de Dios. Y sin embargo Jesús nos dice que tenemos que "odiar" a nuestro padre, madre, esposa, e hijos, hermanos y hermanas si queremos ser sus discípulos. ¿Qué está tratando de decir Jesús? No está predicando el odio, sino que se supone que debemos amar a nuestras familias pero no hacer de ellas un dios o un ídolo. Dios viene antes que nosotros familias, nuestros padres, nuestros cónyuges y nuestros hijos, y de hecho nosotros mismos. no soy lo máximo estándar, y los deseos e intereses de la familia no son los valores más altos que existen. A veces esta verdad se experimenta dolorosamente. Un joven o una joven experimenta un llamado para ser sacerdote o religiosa y los padres no lo apoyan. A cónyuge en un matrimonio se pregunta qué está pasando cuando Dios obviamente toma el primer lugar para él o ella. su esposo Un amigo se sorprende cuando otro amigo rechaza una actividad que él propone porque los alejaría de Dios. Para la persona que trata de seguir a Jesús, la situación puede convertirse en una verdadera cruz. Tal vez por eso Jesús usa una palabra tan dura aquí. Pero más a menudo, es un desafío permitir que Dios gobierne nuestras vidas incluso cuando no hay miembro de la familia para oponerse a nosotros, sino las muchas cosas de este mundo que claman por nuestra atención. Santa Teresa de Calcuta, cuyo día de muerte y tal vez próxima fiesta es El 5 de septiembre nos brindó un hermoso testimonio de ofrecerlo todo, de dejar el hogar y la familia, de hacer que el sentido de su vida sea la persona de Jesucristo. Al servir a los más pobres de los pobres, nos enseña lo que significa la unión con Dios. 
