Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

JOY THAT IS CONTAGIOUS

Saint Luke tells us that “all” of the tax collectors and sinners were drawing near to hear Jesus. Think about this. The very ones that were despised by the “righteous” were the ones who felt drawn toward Jesus. There must have been many of them, such as people who were on the fringe of society in situations of great difficulty, people whose lives were not “in order,” those who could not cope with life. What attracted them to Jesus? Why was it they, in particular, who wanted to hear him? Jesus was really opening his heart to them. Sharing a meal with them was more than just keeping company with them.

Breaking bread with someone meant also sharing their faith. It was as if Jesus was saying, “God has forgiven you, he accepts you, and you are reconciled to him.”

This must have drove the pious people crazy! Jesus replies to his critics with the parables of the lost sheep and of the lost coin, but then especially of the parable of the Prodigal Son. What was Jesus’ secret? He was not indifferent to anyone. He had time for them – and space in his heart for them! Like the shepherd he goes after the lost sheep until he can find it and bring it home. Is it not too great a risk to leave the ninety-nine other sheep only because of the one sheep that was lost? Are the ninety-nine far more important than the one, which has perhaps gotten lost through its own fault? Why should the others suffer because of the one that has gotten lost?

Jesus says that there is more rejoicing over one sheep that is found than over ninety-nine other sheep who have no need of repentance. He is not joking when he refers to these people. But he wants the “pious” people to rejoice over each person who finds his ways. He is neither joking about the rejoicing in heaven. We can take it as true that indeed there is more rejoicing over the one who has been found. This is a joy that is contagious!

San Lucas nos dice que “todos” los recaudadores de impuestos y los pecadores se acercaban para escuchar a Jesús. Piensa sobre esto. Los mismos que fueron despreciados por los “justos” fueron los que se sintieron atraídos hacia Jesús. Debió haber muchos de ellos, como personas que estaban al margen de la sociedad en situaciones de gran dificultad, personas cuyas vidas no estaban “en orden”, aquellas que no podían hacer frente a la vida. ¿Qué los atrajo a Jesús? ¿Por qué eran ellos, en particular, los que querían escucharlo? Jesús realmente les estaba abriendo su corazón. Compartir una comida con ellos era algo más que estar en compañía de ellos. Partir el pan con alguien significaba también compartir su fe. Era como si Jesús estuviera diciendo: “Dios te ha perdonado, te acepta y estás reconciliado con él”. ¡Esto debe haber vuelto loca a la gente piadosa! Jesús responde a sus críticos con las parábolas de la oveja perdida y de la moneda perdida, pero sobre todo con la parábola del hijo pródigo. ¿Cuál era el secreto de Jesús? No era indiferente a nadie. Tenía tiempo para ellos, ¡y espacio en su corazón para ellos! Como el pastor, va tras la oveja perdida hasta que la encuentra y la lleva a casa. ¿No es un riesgo demasiado grande dejar las otras noventa y nueve ovejas solo por la única oveja que se perdió? ¿Son los noventa y nueve mucho más importantes que el uno, que quizás se ha perdido por su propia culpa? ¿Por qué han de sufrir los demás por causa del que se ha perdido? Jesús dice que hay más alegría por una oveja que se encuentra que por otras noventa y nueve ovejas que no tienen necesidad de arrepentimiento. No bromea cuando se refiere a estas personas. Pero él quiere que la gente “piadosa” se regocije por cada persona que encuentra su camino. No está bromeando sobre el regocijo en el cielo. Podemos dar por cierto que en verdad hay más alegría por el que ha sido hallado. ¡Esta es una alegría que se contagia!

On Sunday, August 28th, we celebrated Fr. Devorak's 50th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood. Father Jim was born in Canby, MN, and grew up in Madison, MN.

He was ordained August 27, 1972 for the Diocese of New Ulm at St. Michael in Madison by Bishop Alphonse J. Schladweiler.

Following ordination his parish assignments included: Holy Redeemer in Marshall, Holy Rosary in North Mankato, Holy Rosary in Graceville, St. Barnabas in Barry, St. George in Glencoe, St. Andrew in Fairfax, St. Dionysius in Tyler, St. Genevieve in Lake Benton, St. Pius X in Glencoe, St. Anastasia in Hutchinson, St. Boniface in Stewart, St. Joseph in Montevideo, St. Andrew in Granite Falls, St. Clara in Clara City, St. John in Darwin and assisting in the Seeker of Souls Area Faith Community, St. Gertrude in Forest City, St. Mary in Willmar and assisting in the Jesus Our Living Waters Area Faith Community, St. Patrick in Kandiyohi, St. Thomas More in Lake Lillian, Our Lady of the Lakes in Spicer, St. John in Ortonville, and St. Joseph in Rosen.

Since then, he has served the following parishes in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis: St. Bernard in St. Paul, St. Rose of Lima and Corpus Christi in Roseville, St. Girard in Brooklyn Park, and Immaculate Conception in Watertown. On June 30th, 2021 Fr. Jim retired from active ministry in the Archdiocese. He currently lives in Jordan. He enjoys helping with Masses at Guardian Angels in Chaska, St. Nicholas in Carver, St. John the Baptist in Savage, Pax Christi in Eden Prairie, and other nearby parishes.

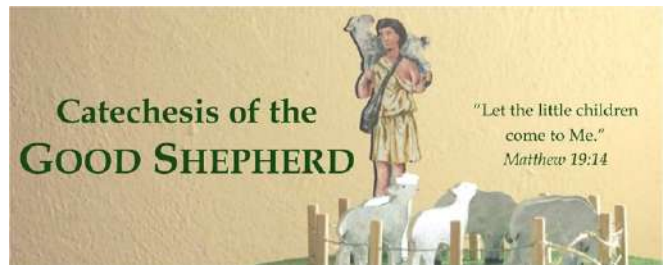


