Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

THE TROUBLESOME WIDOW



The parable of the gospel today that Jesus tells is absolutely taken from life. There is a dishonest judge and a widow and the judge in the parable cares nothing for God or for people's need. The only things that count for him are power and his own welfare. The widow is the picture of misery that cries aloud to heaven.

Why does God allow such injustice in the world today? Where is God when people are at the point of saying "I cannot go on," and there is no way out? Jesus is trying to say to us and to his audience that we ought always to pray. The widow does not ask quietly for what she wants. She

cries aloud and makes herself a nuisance. She gives the judge no peace and harasses him. Should we cry to God like that? Think of Job who cried out to God in his despair and cursed the day that he was born.

One thing is certain: It pleases God more to cry out to him in this way than if we just kept silent. God praised Job, who had unimaginable suffering to bear, and for disputing with him even though God admonished Job in explaining that he was all-powerful and that Job could not know his mysteries. Yet do we dare to talk to God like that? Will we intentionally make our needs known to Him and do so fervently?

People often say, "How can a good God allow such suffering?" Do not ask yourself that. Rather, ask God! Rattle God's door, bang at his heart, like this widow did at the judge's door. Jesus shows us how that is a prayer that will move God's heart. "God will speedily help us," says Jesus. But is that true? When we think of the places of pilgrimage around the world, and votive candles being lit, and Eucharistic chapels being filled with people praying, many people are saying "yes." Will Christ still find faith on Earth? Will he find it in my case? That is what we should pray for!

LA VIUDA PROBLEMÁTICA

La parábola del evangelio de hoy que Jesús cuenta es absolutamente tomada de la vida. Hay un juez des honesto y una viuda y el juez en la parábola no le importa nada a Dios o por la necesidad de las personas. Solo las cosas que cuentan para él son el poder y su propio bienestar. La viuda es la imagen de la miseria que llora en voz alta al cielo. ¿Por qué Dios permite tanta injusticia en el mundo de hoy? ¿Dónde está Dios cuando la gente está en el punto de decir "No puedo continuar", y no hay salida? Jesús está tratando de decirnos a nosotros y a su audiencia que siempre debemos rezar. La viuda no pregunta en silencio lo que quiere. Ella llora en voz alta y se hace una molestia. Ella no le da al juez paz y lo acosa. ¿Deberíamos llorar a Dios así? Piense en Job que gritó a Dios en su desesperación y maldijo el día en que nació. Una cosa es segura: le agrada a Dios llorarle de esta manera que si hubiéramos guardado el silencio. Dios alabó a Job, que tuvo un sufrimiento inimaginable que soportar, y por disputarlo a pesar de que Dios amonestó a Job al explicar que era todopoderoso y que Job no podía conocer sus misterios. Sin embargo, ¿nos atrevemos a hablar con Dios así? ¿Haremos intencionalmente nuestras necesidades conozcas y lo haremos fervientemente? La gente a menudo dice: "¿Cómo puede un buen Dios permitir tal sufrimiento?" No te preguntes eso. ¡Más bien, pregúntale a Dios! Májana la puerta de Dios, golpeó su corazón, como lo hizo esta viuda en la puerta del juez. Jesús nos muestra cómo es una oración que moverá el corazón de Dios. "Dios nos ayudará rápidamente", dice Jesús. ¿Pero es eso cierto? Cuando pensamos en los lugares de peregrinación en todo el mundo, y las velas votivas se encienden, y las capillas eucarísticas están llenas de personas que rezan, muchas personas dicen "sí". ¿Cristo todavía encontrará fe en la tierra? ¿Lo encontrará en mi caso? ¡Para eso debemos orar!


