Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

PRAYING THROUGH DIFFICULT FEELINGS

Have you ever sat down to pray only to be filled with thoughts of resentment toward family members, friends or co-workers? Have you ever brought considerable anger to your prayer? Rather than see these thoughts as bad, as ones that shouldn't be there, or as ones for which God is viewing us as unlovable, they may very well be the place to begin in our prayers. God wants to speak a word to us in these situations of our lives in which we have strong feelings.

In our gospel this Sunday, Jesus tells a parable in which a Pharisee's prayer is compared to that of a tax collector. The Pharisee's prayer is to say, "Thank God, I am not like these other people!"

However, it does not leave him justified. It is the tax collector's prayer in not even raising his eyes to heaven and saying, "Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner," which allows him to go home justified. So when we are angry at the world or at someone else, how do we go from being like the Pharisee in our prayers to being like the humble tax collector?

Times in which we discover anger and criticism in our prayer are times in which God is inviting us to look deeper into ourselves. It may be that we are comparing ourselves to another in order to justify ourselves. Even if we are not, we are invited to see the other person in the light of God's love and mercy. We are invited to consider the human, fallible reasons why they are doing what they are doing. This, in turn, can elicit a great compassion from us toward them, and help us to consider when we too need the same compassion and mercy of others. This, then, enables us to focus once again upon the mercy of God, like the tax collector. We must submit our criticism, our anger, our resentment to God hoping that he would widen our hearts to see the world and each other and ourselves with the eyes of the great Redeemer, Jesus Christ. This is authentic prayer directed toward God and not toward ourselves.

ORAR A TRAVÉS DE SENTIMIENTOS DIFÍCILES

¿Alguna vez te sentaste a orar solo para llenarte de pensamientos de resentimiento hacia familiares, amigos o compañeros de trabajo? ¿Alguna vez has provocado una ira considerable en tu oración? En lugar de ver estos pensamientos como malos, como los que no deberían estar ahí, o como aquellos por los cuales Dios nos ve como desagradables, es muy posible que sean el lugar para comenzar en nuestras oraciones. Dios quiere hablarnos una palabra en estas situaciones de nuestra vida en las que tenemos sentimientos fuertes. En nuestro evangelio de este domingo, Jesús cuenta una parábola en la que se compara la oración de un fariseo con la de un recaudador de impuestos. La oración del fariseo es decir: "¡Gracias a Dios, no soy como estas otras personas!" Sin embargo, no lo deja justificado. Es la oración del recaudador de impuestos en ni siquiera levantar los ojos al cielo y decir: "Señor, ten piedad de mí, pecador", lo que le permite volver a casa justificado. Entonces, cuando estamos enojados con el mundo o con alguien más, ¿cómo pasamos de ser como el fariseo en nuestras oraciones a ser como el humilde recaudador de impuestos? Los momentos en los que descubrimos la ira y la crítica en nuestra oración son momentos en los que Dios nos está invitando a profundizar en nosotros mismos. Puede ser que nos estemos comparando con otro para justificarnos. Incluso si no lo somos, estamos invitados a ver a la otra persona a la luz del amor y la misericordia de Dios. Estamos invitados a considerar las razones humanas y falibles por las que están haciendo lo que están haciendo. Esto, a su vez, puede provocar una gran compasión de nosotros hacia ellos y ayudarnos a considerar cuándo también necesitamos la misma compasión y misericordia de los demás. Esto, entonces, nos permite centrarnos una vez más en la misericordia de Dios, como el recaudador de impuestos. Debemos someter nuestra crítica, nuestra ira, nuestro resentimiento a Dios con la esperanza de que él ensanche nuestros corazones para ver al mundo ya los demás ya nosotros mismos con los ojos del gran Redentor, Jesucristo. Esta es la auténtica oración dirigida a Dios y no a nosotros mismos.


