Matrimony: Marriage preparation is required. Please call Father Tony VanderLoop, Pastor, at 952-679-9415 at least 8 months in advance.

Anointing: If you wish to receive an anointing please call the Parish Office: (952) 227-4000.

Communion for the Homebound: When we come together to pray at our Eucharistic liturgy, we do not forget the members of our community who are unable to be with us because of ill health. We remember them in our prayers, and we wish to include them in our Holy Communion. Members of our community bring the Blessed Sacrament to them to comfort them and to unite us in the Eucharist. We are not always aware of those who have this need. Please call the Parish Office to let us know if you or a member of your family would like to have Holy Communion brought to them. That way we can schedule a time for our ministers to visit and bring the Sacrament.

Hospital, Nursing Home, Homebound Visits: Churches are no longer notified by hospitals or nursing homes when a parishioner is admitted unless the family has requested it. If you or a family member are homebound, hospitalized or in a nursing home and would like a visit from a member of the ministry staff, please call the Parish Office.

GIVE AND SOMETHING GREATER IN RETURN WILL BE GIVEN TO YOU

A few years ago, I was at the airport ready to catch a flight. I was checking in my bag and an agent passed by pointing out that my bag weighed 53 pounds and was overweight. I nervously opened my bag on the spot and hurriedly took out a couple pairs of jeans and a sweater and stuffed them into my backpack. The problem for me that day was that I hadn't really had time to pack. I hadn't had time to consider what I didn't need to take with me.

Our life is like this. We must consider what we cannot take with us. Jesus makes this point to the Sadducees who try to trip him up because they didn't believe in the resurrection. They make up a

story about a woman who has seven husbands, six of whom die. They ask, "Whose wife will she be in heaven?" Jesus not only affirms that there will be a resurrection, but that it will be so radically transforming, that there will not even be marriage. We cannot even take marriage with us!

This may be disappointing because we will want to see our spouse in heaven—and maybe we will. However in our risen state, everything that we have experienced on Earth will be radically transformed. Our Lord is saying that everything, including marriage, will be brought to a much higher degree of perfection. In the resurrection, a type of intimacy with God will be maintained that is so much greater even than the intimacy of marriage!

Our gospel story also helps us focus on our belief in the resurrection of the body. We believe that though our earthly bodies will decay, we will receive new, glorified bodies in the resurrection. We cannot even hold on to our very own bodies. Yet, in letting them go, they will be transformed.

We see this greater and new beginning take place in so many thing now on Earth. A seed dies only to rise as a beautiful flower or life-giving vine or tree that produces fruit or vegetables. As we give away our possessions—our time, talent, and treasure, which we cannot take with us—we see that this new beginning and transformation begins now. What we give away, what we let go of, and what we offer to God is made into something new and transformed, something beautiful for God—for the poor, for the community, for our parish and for our families!

DA Y SE TE DARÁ ALGO MAYOR A CAMBIO

Hace unos años, estaba en el aeropuerto listo para tomar un vuelo. Estaba facturando mi maleta y pasó un agente señalando que mi maleta pesaba 53 libras y tenía sobrepeso. Nerviosamente abrí mi bolso en el acto y rápidamente saqué un par de jeans y un suéter y los metí en mi mochila. El problema para mí ese día fue que realmente no había tenido tiempo de empacar. No había tenido tiempo de considerar lo que no necesitaba llevar conmigo. Nuestra vida es así. Debemos considerar lo que no podemos llevar con nosotros. Jesús señala este punto a los saduceos que tratan de hacerlo tropezar porque no creían en la resurrección. Inventan una historia sobre una mujer que tiene siete maridos, seis de los cuales mueren. Ellos preguntan: "¿De quién será esposa en el cielo?" Jesús no sólo afirma que habrá resurrección, sino que será tan radicalmente transformadora, que ni siguiera habrá matrimonio. ¡Ni siguiera podemos casarnos con nosotros! Esto puede ser decepcionante porque querremos ver a nuestro cónyuge en el cielo, y tal vez lo hagamos. Sin embargo, en nuestro estado resucitado, todo lo que hemos experimentado en la Tierra se transformará radicalmente. Nuestro Señor está diciendo que todo, incluso el matrimonio, será llevado a un grado mucho más alto de perfección. ¡En la resurrección se mantendrá un tipo de intimidad con Dios mucho mayor que la intimidad del matrimonio! Nuestra historia del evangelio también nos ayuda a centrarnos en nuestra creencia en la resurrección del cuerpo. Creemos que aunque nuestros cuerpos terrenales se pudran, recibiremos cuerpos nuevos y glorificados en la resurrección. Ni siguiera podemos aferrarnos a nuestros propios cuerpos. Sin embargo, al dejarlos ir, serán transformados. Vemos que este mayor y nuevo comienzo tiene lugar en tantas cosas ahora en la Tierra. Una semilla muere solo para crecer como una hermosa flor o una vid que da vida o un árbol que produce frutas o verduras. A medida que regalamos nuestras posesiones, nuestro tiempo, talento y tesoro, que no podemos llevar con nosotros, vemos que este nuevo comienzo y transformación comienza ahora. ¡Lo que damos, lo que soltamos y lo que ofrecemos a Dios se convierte en algo nuevo y transformado, algo hermoso para Dios, para los pobres, para la comunidad, para nuestra parroquia y para nuestras familias!
