

# THE HARD CASES



On this anniversary day of the infamous Supreme Court decision of Roe vs. Wade, that was thankfully overturned, the need to consider how to care for mothers and fathers in various difficult pregnancy situations and the need to give witness to the Gospel of Life, has never been greater. In October in the run-up to the elections, we saw a lot of political ads on television about the so-called "hard cases" of a choice to abort a child conceived through rape or incest. Cases in which the life of the mother is in danger is another hard case, but I will consider that in a separate article. If politicians can talk about these cases in October, then I, as your pastor, can talk about them in January.

First of all, I urge you to read the article posted by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops by Sandra Mahkorn, MD, MPH, MS a family physician and former counselor for sexual assault victims. It is found at: <u>https://www.usccb.org/committees/pro-life-activities/life-matters-pregnancy-rape</u>. The argument by pro-abortion advocates for abortion in these cases seems to be that it would be cruel and a re-victimization to take away the so-called right to abortion when the mother of that child has already been victimized.

Abortion advocates perpetuate the myth that pregnant rape victims generally desire abortion. But, as the above-referenced article points out, the mother of that child does not stop being the person that she was prior to the terrible event of rape that has happened to her. She brings into this horrible injustice of the crime committed against her and difficult journey to healing all of her beliefs, her sense of right and wrong, and everything else that she is. The abortion rate among rape victims (50 percent) is not substantially higher than among all women who report an "unintended pregnancy" (40 percent).

What a mother in these situations needs is personal compassion, friendship, and real resources to help her in this most difficult time in her life. Does it really help a pregnant victim of rape to say that your situation is hopeless. Just get rid of the problem and you will begin to heal and get over it. Is this real compassion? Is it real compassion to offer to the mother a death sentence for her child only because of the circumstances in which she or he was conceived? Offering such a violent solution to a difficult circumstance only re-victimizes the mother and leaves her feeling the same regret that other mothers who chose abortion feel.

On the other hand, the article mentions that in one study, two-thirds of mothers who continued their pregnancy developed more positive feelings toward the child. Pregnancy resource centers such as Southwest Options for Women in Eden Prairie are places where relationships of healing and compassion can begin. They are places which offer pre-natal care, material assistance to care for a baby, parenting education and counseling, even where trauma is present. They are places where mothers and fathers are offered a true helping hand in an ongoing relationship of healing and trust. In my experience of talking with volunteers in this ministry and hearing testimonies at open houses and fundraising events, I hear two things over and over again. First, that those who come to such centers have often experienced family trauma in their lives. Second, that those who chose abortion say that if even one person would have told them that they didn't have to abort their child, they would have had their child.

Pregnant mothers need real solutions that help her and her child as whole persons even in tragic situations. Offering a very dangerous pill or surgery to end the life of the child lacks this compassion. This is why we continue to give witness to the Gospel of Life with the various gifts that God has given us!
