

TO FOLLOW HIM WILL BE OUR STRENGTH

What if I behave in such a way, on the straight and narrow path, that others could take advantage of me? If I am completely honest in my business life and always tell the truth, will I not then be cheated by others? If someone offends me when I do all I can to follow Jesus and root out my own sinfulness, will I be able to forgive them?

In a church basement in bombed-out Germany in 1947 Corrie Ten Boom, who with her sister, Betsie, had endured the horror of a concentration camp, had given a speech and people were filing out in silence. The solemn faces stared back at her, not quite daring to

believe her message about forgiveness. Yet, there was never any question in a talk in Germany in 1947. She had told them that she'd like to think that forgiven sins are cast into the deepest ocean and then God places a sign out there that says, "No fishing allowed."

Then she saw him working his way toward her. "You mentioned Ravensbruck in your talk," he was saying. "I was a guard there." He did not remember her. She remembered the shame of walking naked past this man with her sister, who later died in the camp. "But since that time I have become a Christian. I know that God has forgiven me for the cruel things that I did there, but I would like to hear it from your lips as well." His hand came out, "Will you forgive me?" Woodenly, mechanically, she thrust her hand into his. Then an incredible thing took place. A healing warmth flowed through her shoulder and down her arm and flooded her whole being, bringing tears to her eyes.

"I forgive you, brother," she cried. "With all my heart." She never knew God's love so intensely as she did then. God is love. This love comes not from our own strength, but from God. This is why Saint Paul could say, "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good" (Rom 12:21). If we render ourselves capable of loving even those who mistreat us by following Jesus' words on the Sermon on the Mount, we will be like God, who is good to all whether they thank him or not.
