OUR LORD'S DIVINE MERCY



Happy Easter everyone! I wish you and your families a grace-filled Easter season that brings your family together by his love which has conquered all sin and death. I wish to write today about, Divine Mercy Sunday. This Sunday, the second Sunday of Easter, was declared Divine Mercy Sunday by Pope John Paul II on April 30th, 2000 at the canonization of Sister Faustina Kowalska. This day was rightly regarded as so important by our late and beloved pope, that he was made Blessed in Rome on this very day on May 1st 2011 and canonized a saint on this very day on April 27th, 2014. The last text prepared by our late and beloved Holy Father, written from his hospital bed and read

after his death teaches us about the great gift of Divine Mercy. He writes, "Today the glorious Alleluia of Easter resounds. Today's Gospel from John emphasizes that on the evening of that day he appeared to the Apostles and 'showed them his hands and his side' (Jn 20:20), that is, the sign of the painful passion with which his Body was indelibly stamped, even after the Resurrection. Those glorious wounds, which he allowed doubting Thomas to touch eight days later, reveal the mercy of God who 'so loved the world that he gave his only Son' (Jn 3:16). ...Lord, who revealed the Father's love by your death and Resurrection, we believe in you and confidently repeat to you today: "Jesus, I trust in you, have mercy upon us and upon the whole world."

Mercy, which we are completely dependent on, is a hallmark of our Catholic faith. In fact, our beloved and late pope called mercy love's second name. The corporal and spiritual works of mercy flow from divine mercy itself revealed so vividly to Thomas. In the Good Samaritan parable, Jesus answers a man's question, "Who is my neighbor?" by showing that the neighbor is one who shows mercy. In the Last Judgment of Matthew 25 the sheep that are saved are the ones who did works of mercy – feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, visiting the sick, visiting the imprisoned and burying the dead. These would be later called the Corporal Works of Mercy. And the account that Jesus gives of the Last Judgment reveals to us that when they are done to the least brothers and sisters they are done to Jesus.

I encourage you to pray the novena of Divine Mercy which began on Good Friday (you can begin now and catch up). I also encourage you to come to our Divine Mercy Sunday celebration and prayer at 3:30 PM this Sunday as well as our Sunday Mass. Blessings to you and your family on this Octave day of our Lord's Resurrection!

NEW SUPPORT GROUP AND HOMEBOUND MINISTRY INITIATIVES FOR CLERGY ABUSE VICTIM/SURVIVORS

The Office of Ministerial Standards and Safe Environment is excited to announce two new initiatives being offered through our Office of Outreach, Restorative Justice, and Abuse Prevention for Victim/Survivors.

First, we will be hosting a new, ongoing support group for current and former employees of faith-based institutions who have experienced abuse. Anyone is welcome to join with others who have had similar experiences to receive support, affirmation, and healing. This confidential support group will welcome members from all over the United States and any other countries. It will meet virtually (via Zoom) the second Thursday of every month beginning April 13th.

Second, we are pleased to announce a new homebound ministry for victim/survivors of clergy abuse to receive the Eucharist. Individuals unable for any reason to receive this sacrament at a parish will now have the ability to receive the Eucharist in their own homes brought to them by a Communion Minister who is also a victim/survivor of clergy abuse.

THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

There are many laws in the Canon Law Code that govern Mass intentions and stipends, but here are some of the important points (from Canon 948 and 534):

1. We can only accept one party (and one payment) per Mass. We can have more than one name, however, included by the person requesting the Mass. The suggested donation in our Archdiocese for each Mass intention is \$10.00.

2. We must assign <u>"For the People"</u> as our Mass intention for one Mass per Saturday evening or Sunday and for one Mass for a Holy Day of Obligation. Therefore, we can only assign a personal or family intention to all but one Mass on any given Saturday or Sunday or any given Holy Day of Obligation.

3. If a Mass "For the People" is missed by the pastor, it must be applied as soon as possible. For example, it may be applied to a daily Mass, in which case it becomes unavailable for personal or family intentions.

4. There are also several special days during the year that are scheduled for specific intentions at the pastor's discretion. For example, on All Souls Day our Mass intention is, "For all of the Souls in Purgatory," in which case this Mass is, therefore, unavailable for a personal or family intention.

Specific Information for Guardian Angels and St. Nicholas

1. All Mass intentions for Saturday evening and Sunday Masses are included in the **Prayers of the Faithful** read at each Mass.

2. When requesting Masses, each person can request a maximum of twelve Masses in a calendar year, with six of those Masses scheduled as weekend Masses, and six taking place during the week.

3. Mass intention requests can be made by phone (952) 227-4000, send an email (<u>info@gachaska.org</u>), or in-person during office hours (Monday & Friday 8:30am-12:30pm and Tuesday -Thursday 8:30am – 4:30pm).

The Mass schedule for the following year is open as of June 1st of the current year.
