

WHY SMALL GROUPS?



Maybe it is because of the 225 stations that you have on cable. Possibly it is because of your crazy schedule and your kid's sports. And let's not forget about the endless screens that bombard us with endless information. Whatever the cause, Americans are increasingly disconnected with a sense of community. This, according to Robert D. Putnam in his book, Bowling Alone, has led to a capital deficit that threatens educational performance, safe neighborhoods, democratic responsiveness, and even our health and happiness.

Yet, we hear in Acts 2:44, 46-47, "All the believers were together and held everything in

common...Every day they devoted themselves to meeting together in the temple area and to breaking bread in their homes. They ate their meals with exultation and sincerity of heart, praising God and enjoying favor with all the people." Without Christ-centered friendships, our walk of faith will most certainly be a slower, less steady one, and we're far more likely to fall and to fail. When we have friendships in which Christ is a central part, we connect with Him in a way that we will not on our own. In other words we will grow in faith relationally.

Historically, friendship and fellowship, in most Catholic parishes, have been promoted through various fraternal societies and clubs. But now, there seems to be a generational change and we can debate what those changes are. Fellowship and support happened more effortlessly in these settings than those of today. We must be more deliberate and intentional. People might have friends who are in our congregation, but how many friends *from* church do we have? At funerals and weddings only a handful of parishioners come to show support to the families involved.

But Saint John Paul II, after much synodal discussion in 1987, wrote an Apostolic Exhortation called "On the Laity" or "Christifidelis Laici." In paragraph no. 26 he wrote, "So that all parishes...may be truly communities of Christians, local ecclesiastical authorities ought to foster...small, basic, or so-called "living" communities, where the faithful can communicate the word of God and express it in service and love to one another; these communities are true expressions of ecclesiastical communion and centers of evangelization, in communion with their pastors."

What this means is that, for the Church to have the right impact on us and on our faith, we must build community. We may have congregation, but we must build a community in which even the newest members among us feel quite comfortable in finding a place to belong. It is not enough in our world today to simply say, "Come to Mass." Our purpose is described well in Acts: 2: 44-47. We are not called to be "congregation." We are called to be community!

Next week, I will write more about some specifics about small groups and their purpose. May God bless us in implementing the first year of our pastoral plan in which the Archbishop wants everyone to be a part of a small group!
