

MY TIME AWAY WAS GREAT AND BENEFICIAL

From June 30th to July 26th, I took part in the Alverna Priestly Renewal at the Alverna Retreat Center in Winona with five other brother priests from this archdiocese and three more from the Diocese of Winona-Rochester. The renewal was offered by our archdiocesan Institute for Ongoing Clergy Formation. This was a unique opportunity for me and very timely. I liken it to going into the locker room at halftime and making some adjustments and catching a breather. Will it be half-time? God only knows, but I was ordained at 35.5 years old, and I have been a priest for 21 years. I would love to serve for

as long as I can and hope to live a long life, but we never know.

To use another corny sports analogy, I would love to start dribbling with my left hand in my ministry. It is important, as we find little ways to approach things and cope with the challenges of what we are doing, to reassess, and go forth in a way that we really don't know. As Saint John of the Cross once said, "To become what you are not, you must go by a way you know not." That is a real challenge. For me, it centers quite a bit on how to not work so hard that I go home at 9:00, 10:00 and sometimes even 11:00 at night. It can be quite challenging with all the demands, but there are ways. These ways involve a greater trust in God and others. It is your God-given Baptismal right to contribute what you can to build up the Church. The priest cannot do it all.

So, the renewal began with a focus on spiritual formation, followed by a silent retreat. During the silent retreat, we met with a spiritual director for one hour each day. Mine was Father Brian Fischer. He gave each of us directees four scripture passages each day upon which to reflect. This was a very good retreat for me. Then, we had a week of human formation and finished up with conversations around pastoral ministry and leadership. Several moderators came to visit us and led our discussions. It was very, very beneficial to hear the stories of my fellow brother priests and talk about them. We shared a lot in common. But each priest had a little different experience from which to draw wisdom.

It was very nice to be able to take a deep look at my priesthood so that I can serve you, the parishioners and the wider community as best as I can. I didn't have to think about packing up and going home soon and this gave me the opportunity to grow through the experience in my understanding of what God is asking me to do. We all sought a deep and lasting renewal in Christ. This happened through our morning prayer together, the various sessions we had, holy Mass, lunches together, afternoon recreation, Holy Hours, supper together, and evening and afternoon reading. We also had the opportunity to have cookouts together and attend the Minnesota Orchestra, a showing of the play "Hamlet" by Shakespeare, and a wine tasting event at a local winery. Winona has many unique cultural attractions and offerings.

I treasure the bond that I experienced with my brother priests, and, by God's grace, the renewal experience will help me and all of us serve the Church better.


