OUR GUARDIAN ANGELS PROTECT US AND ENLIGHTEN US

Angels appear often and are spoken of often in Sacred Scripture, many times by our Lord Himself. For example, in our Gospel reading for our patronal feast day of last week, October 2nd, Jesus says in Matthew 18:10, when referring to how we should treat children, "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father."

That Jesus speaks of children's angels is not a mere afterthought. Our catechism teaches us that every human being has a guardian angel appointed to him or her by God. Our guardian angels act as messengers to protect us, guide us, and illumine our minds in order that, by this grace of God, the way to God would be more easily known. Scripture reveals this to us. At the most important moments of human history angels have served as ambassadors of God to point out the way and convey the divine will. An example of this is when the angel Gabriel appeared to the Blessed Virgin Mary and revealed to her that she would bear a son and that the people would call him Emmanuel. And the angels adore the God who has come to the earth to save us. At the Mass during the Night of Christmas, we hear in Luke's gospel (Luke 2:14) that an angel appeared to the shepherds announcing that the Lord has come. And then we hear, "And suddenly there was a multitude of the heavenly host with the angel, praising God and saying: 'Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests.'"

Scripture has this to say of them: "Are they not all ministering spirits sent for service, for the sake of those who shall inherit salvation?" (Heb. 1:14). Faith in the mission of the angels is what moved Jacob to exclaim when he blesses his grandchildren, the sons of Joseph "May the angel who redeemed me from all evil bless them." (Gen. 48:16).

So the angels are protectors and guardians, but how exactly? We have free will – the ability to do good and the ability to do evil. Do the angels interfere with or influence our choice? Indirectly, one could say, they do. The angels have not received a mission to interfere with our free will. Rather, they have received a mission to save us from the results of our own evil deeds as far as is compatible with the higher dictates of God's justice. We should not go speeding down the highway and then pray that our guardian angel will protect us. But we should pray that the good choices we have made will have their desired effect and that the natural consequences of the not-so-good choices we have made may be lessened. But beyond this, we do well to pray that our guardian angels would enlighten us and illumine the way through life which has its spiritual and physical dangers and unknowns. We do well to pray that our guardian angels would help to light our way with greater faith and understanding that moves us to make good and loving choices.

Sometimes, our guardian angels can act in even extraordinary ways. An example of when an angel showed his protecting power is when he delivered Peter from prison. So our angels express the great power of God. Yet these kinds of miraculous works are extraordinary. Illumination of our minds is the most direct and constant effect of the angels guidance. Saint Thomas Aquinas says that it is not too much to say that the human race is kept in mental equilibrium through the unceasing watchfulness of the good spirits.

Perhaps we can pray to our guardian angels together as a parish in order that our guardian angels can illumine our minds and hearts to choose a way toward a flourishing, charitable, witnessing, and very welcoming parish. If you have any ideas exactly how, let me know.

Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day [or night] be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.
