THE SAINTS WHO ENCOURAGE AND ACCOMPANY US

As we reflect upon the saints who are our heroes in the faith and our own call to holiness, I encourage you to read the relatively short Apostolic Exhortation by Pope Francis, *Rejoice and Be Glad*, which can be found at www.vatican.va, the Vatican website. The Latin name for this exhortation is *Guadete et Exsultate* in which he writes on the call to holiness in the modern world.

Our Pope writes of how our scriptures encourage us to “run with perseverance the race that is set before us” (Hebrews 12:1) and how the saints have done so as a great cloud of witnesses who preserve their bonds of communion and love with us. We are surrounded, led, and guided by the friends of God who are there to sustain and protect us. The processes of beatification and canonization certainly help us to recognize the signs of heroic virtue that they possessed and their sacrifices of their lives even to death.

Even so, we need not think only of those beatified or canonized. We can think of the holiness of ordinary people who make up our community of faith: those who raise their children with immense love, those who work hard to support their families, and those who are sick, but who never lose their smile. Sometimes we never really know the depth of holiness of some who have quietly lived their lives in communion with Christ, but who nevertheless have shaped history in their unity with Jesus together with countless faithful people.

We are all called to holiness! It is our basic Baptismal call. The Second Vatican Council, in the document, *Lumen Gentium* (no. 11), stated this emphatically: “Strengthened by so many and such great means of salvation, all the faithful, whatever their condition or state, are called by the Lord – each in his or her own way – to that perfect holiness by which the Father himself is perfect.” This may seem like an unattainable goal when we think of such great examples as the saints. However, God’s life is communicated to us, each in his or her own unique way.

To be holy does not require us to be a bishop, priest, or religious sister. Rather, whether we are married, whether we work, or whether we are a parent or grandparent, we have the opportunity to care for our spouse, to carry out our work faithfully, or to raise our children in the ways of God. The holiness to which God calls us will grow, Pope Francis says, through small gestures. A woman goes shopping, she meets a neighbor, and they begin to speak, and the gossip starts. But she says in her heart: “No, I will not speak badly of anyone.” This is a step forward in holiness. Later at home, one of her children wants to talk to her about his hopes and dreams, and even though she is tired, she sits down and listens with patience and love. That is another sacrifice that brings holiness. Later she experiences some anxiety, but recalling the love of the Virgin Mary, she takes her rosary and prays with faith. This is yet another path of holiness. Later, she goes out and encounters a poor person and stops to say a kind word to him. This is one more step on the path to holiness.

Some days we are challenged by holiness and the pressures of life seem to crowd out our ability to act in holiness. Yet, through these challenges, the Lord calls us, once again, to a deeper conversion that can make his grace more evident in our lives and to those around us. At other times, we are aware of our own sinfulness. But when we feel the temptation to dwell on our own weakness, we can raise our eyes to the Lord, acknowledge our sins, and ask him to work the miracle of making us a little bit better.

As we look to the saints, let us always remember that today is a great day to walk the path a little further in living out the Beatitudes and living a greater degree of holiness. Dear Lord, make our parishes holy parishes!

VATICAN RELEASES MASCOT FOR JUBILEE YEAR 2025

Ahead of the 2025 Jubilee, the Vatican has launched a cartoon mascot unveiled Monday as the cheerful face of the Catholic Church's upcoming holy year.

The mascot, name Luce—which means “light” in Italian—is intended to engage a younger audience and guide visitors through the holy year.

The mascot will debut this week at the Lucca Comics and Games, Italy's celebrated convention for all things comics, video games, and fantasy, where the Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelization will host a space dedicated to “Luce and Friends.”

It will be the first time that a Vatican dicastery participates in a comics convention. [Archbishop] Fisichella, who serves as the pro-prefect of the Dicastery for Evangelization's section for the new evangelization said he hopes taking part in the convention “will allow us to speak to younger generations about the theme of hope, which is more central than ever in the evangelical message.”

Clad in a yellow raincoat, mud-stained boots, and a pilgrim's cross, Luce's mission is to guide young pilgrims toward hope and faith with her trusty dog Santino at her side. Shells glimmer in her eyes, recalling the scallop shell of the Camino de Santiago, an emblem of the pilgrimage journey.

Luce's yellow sailor's raincoat is a nod to both the Vatican flag and to journeying through life's storms. The mascot's muddy boots represent a long a difficult journey, while her staff symbolizes the pilgrimage toward eternity.

A jubilee is a special holy year of grace and pilgrimage in the Catholic Church. It typically takes place once every 25 years, though the pope can call for extraordinary jubilee years more often.
