THE MEANING OF ADVENT



If we want to have the best Christmas ever, the most important thing of all is to make room in our hearts to receive Jesus. Saint John the Baptist is a great example of what we must do to make room in our hearts. He made one of the most memorable statements in the gospels when he said, "He must increase, and I must decrease" (Jn 3:30). To make room in our hearts is to make room for his coming – or in a more profound sense, his coming by way of increasing in our lives. It is to anticipate that our Lord will come in a new way in our lives. But, if there is no anticipation, no longing for this, then there is no opening

of our hearts nor new reception of him.

The term Advent is derived from the Latin word adventus which means "coming." It focuses not only on the past coming of Jesus on the first Christmas, but also on the present coming of Jesus through His Word, in the sacraments, in other people, prayer, love, truth, personal experience, and the future coming of Jesus at the Second or Final Coming at the end of the world: the Parousia or the Last Judgment. So John the Baptist cried out from the desert, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths" (Mt 3:3) which is what we are called to do during this holy season.

Saint John the Baptist has much to teach us about Advent. Jesus said that he is the greatest of all prophets because the other prophets prepared the people for a Messiah who would come in the long-distant future, but John the Baptist prepared the people for the Messiah whose coming was imminent. As Jesus was approaching, John the Baptist could point to Him and say, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" (Jn 1:29,36). He had a miraculous birth as John's mother, Elizabeth, was elderly and past child-bearing age. He was filled with the Holy Spirit even while he was in his mother's womb (Lk 1:15) and was chosen by God to be the "forerunner" of Christ. He preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Mk 1:4) because he wanted his listeners to renounce sin, be washed of their past impurities, and be in the state of grace when Jesus appeared. If we wish to be well-prepared for the solemn feast of Christmas, we would be wise to do likewise.

At Christmas there was no room for the Holy Family in the inn. This is a problem for us today. Our minds are overcrowded with news, information, and many ways to distract ourselves. Our hearts can be overcrowded with innumerable concerns and our schedules with innumerable things to do. But, no matter how busy we may be, no matter how many mental preoccupations we may have on our minds, we must set aside time and space to welcome Emmanuel, God-With-Us, who is Jesus our Savior. He is the true gift of Christmas.

So, it is crucial that we go off alone to converse with our Messiah and Lord in silence and solitude, and reflect with imagination and wonder at the great mystery of our Lord's coming as the Son of God and the Son of Man into our world. We can read the first two chapters of Luke's gospel, the infancy narrative and prayerfully reflect on it. We can say the Joyful Mysteries of the rosary. And we can listen to sacred music that reflects the hope of Advent in his coming.

When we make time and space for Jesus, we render ourselves capable of bringing Jesus to others, following in the way of our Blessed Mother Mary who gave Christ to the world. May God richly bless our Advent together at Guardian Angels and Saint Nicholas in order that we may all be true bearers of Christ to others.

Examination of Conscience

Do I believe in God and have faith in God? Do I pray? When I pray, do I really raise my heart and mind to God or is it a matter of words only? Do I turn to God in times of temptation?

A Jubilee Year Begins!

Dear Friends in Christ,

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has declared 2025 (the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord) to be a Jubilee Year of Hope. As Advent begins, rekindling our hope is a great and appropriate theme for our churches of Guardian Angels and Saint Nicholas. Our pope calls this an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." Pope Francis stated in his letter announcing the Jubilee 2025: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision. The forthcoming Jubilee can contribute greatly to restoring a climate of hope and trust as a prelude to the renewal and rebirth that we so urgently desire..."

Advent teaches us to hope in a person who, out of love for us, was born among us -- our Savior Jesus Christ, the King. We hear in Advent of the people of the Old Testament who had the courage to hope for big things: that the desert would be turned into fertile land; that the blind would see, the deaf hear and the lame walk; that their scattered and divided people would eventually be gathered again and united in the blessings of everlasting peace. We celebrate and ponder the Blessed Virgin Mary who never failed to hope in the words of Angel Gabriel to her. We hope with Joseph, with John the Baptist, with Simeon and Anna, with Elizabeth and Zechariah, in recognizing the presence of our Savior in the world.

This Advent, we will dare to hope for big things for our parish and its revitalization as we continue our expectant prayer and worship, continue our participation in small groups, and dream of a new Catholic pre-school. We will imagine the possibilities of new ways that the Lord will come to us personally as we build a community of faith. But we acknowledge that this hope is only possible by our repentance, our alertness to his daily presence, and our faithfulness that Mary and Joseph show us so profoundly. He is Emmanuel – God with Us – God who searches and hopes for us to receive Him in the Holy Eucharist at Mass. Let His search for you be successful. Come to Mass this Advent and Christmas season to meet the one who truly fulfills our hope. May God bless you and your family this Advent and Christmas!
