

COME AND CELEBRATE HOLINESS WITH OUR BLESSED MOTHER

The Immaculate Conception is our Catholic belief that the Virgin Mary was free of original sin from the moment of her conception. Tradition has always held this belief and yet it was not defined as a dogma until 1854 by Pope Pius IX in the papal bull *Ineffabilis Deus*. Mary is free of original sin! We celebrate with her all that we are destined to be when we make our purgatorial journey, come to heaven, and are made pure. We are destined to holiness as she is holy. She is a great model of what we will become. When we think about what

holiness is like in our human lives, we can think of her. Placing all her hope in the words of the Angel Gabriel, she was a completely faithful handmaid of the Lord who hoped in God's promises even as she watched her Son suffer. Now, she shares in her Son's glory as the Queen of Heaven and Earth and the Mother of the Church.

We might say, "That is great for her, but I am a sinful person." She was not subject to the tinder that ignites the fires of sin. She did not suffer from the effects of sin internally like we do. Yet she underwent suffering in this world on behalf of all humanity. So we celebrate her victory over sin in her own life as she remained faithful. We do so with great hope in what, like her, we shall become. We honor her as one who suffered as the Mother of God for all humanity.

How do we best celebrate her holiness and reflect upon what holiness looks like? How do we best come to hope in our own redemption and, with her, hope for the redemption of all humanity? By coming to Mass on the day of the Immaculate Conception, we bring our love for her and our hope in her intercession for us.

This year, December 8th occurs on the Second Sunday of Advent. In accordance with liturgical and canon law, the liturgical celebration of the Immaculate Conception is, for this year, transferred to Monday, December 9th, 2024. The Holy See has recently clarified that, in contrast to the prevalent understanding in the United States, the usual obligation for the faithful to attend Mass on the Solemnity applies even when the celebration is transferred to December 9th.

Due to many parishes already establishing their Mass schedules and past practice of not anticipating that December 9th would be a Holy Day of obligation, and difficulty in adjusting schedules and finding additional priests at this late date the Archbishop <u>DISPENSES FROM THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF SAINT PAUL AND MINNEAPOLIS ON DECEMBER 9, 2024.</u> This dispensation applies to those who live in or are physically present in the territory of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis on December 9, 2024.

However, those who are able to observe the Solemnity by participation at Mass are strongly encouraged to do so. WE WILL HAVE HOLY MASS AT 9:00 AM IN ENGLISH ON MONDAY, DECEMBER 9TH WITH FULL MUSIC AT GUARDIAN ANGELS. If you cannot easily attend Mass, all who enjoy the benefit of this dispensation are exhorted to commemorate the Immaculate Conception in another fitting manner, such as by reciting the Liturgy of the Hours or reflecting on the readings for the day, or engaging in prayer either individually, with others, or as a family.

As we each honor this special day dedicated to Our Blessed Mother, the Patroness of the United States of America, let us reflect on her perfect holiness, her great love for us, and her unique role in sharing in the saving work of her son, Jesus as we ask for her intercession for this nation. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us!
