

### PRAY FOR OUR PRESIDENT AND OUR COUNTRY

I have always found this time of year to be a time of greater civic awareness with so many important and significant events coming up. We will have Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday as a holiday. We will have the March for Life in Washington, DC. And we will inaugurate our new president. Please pray for our president, for our elected and civic officials, and for our country. No matter what your political leanings are, it is always good and important to pray for our national, local, and world leaders. What greater good can we do in our political engagement than to commend all who are in positions of authority to

the God of grace? We do this simply because we are able to do so.

It is undoubtedly true that we have certain feelings about our political leaders and we may even wonder what God is up to as we see their imperfections. However, Saint Paul says to the Romans (13:1), "Let every person be subordinate to the higher authorities, for there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been established by God." So we trust in God knowing that they face unique and demanding pressures even though they are still human. We should pray for them in the task they face, that they'd have the wisdom and strength to govern us wisely and effectively.

At the same time, our call is a call not only to prayer, but to action. But even before we take action, we must humbly do our best to properly form our consciences as we navigate our way through a complex world with complex issues. Just because they are complex does not mean that we should submit to a kind of paralysis and throw up our hands and say, "I can't do anything." We humbly accept that what we do is perhaps small, but can make a difference that someone benefits from and moves us closer to a just world.

What do we mean by forming consciences? All of us are deeply obligated to form our consciences of what is just and right. Our own reasoning is naturally good, but is also enlightened by the teaching of Christ which is best put into current context by our Catholic Church. The Church does not tell us who to vote for, but the Church is indeed the place where our consciences are formed in terms of the gospel teachings of Christ applied to our world today and how our participation can make them become a reality in our world today. The document, "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility," calls us to responsible citizenship through participation in political life. It speaks of this as a moral obligation. I invite you to read the summary of the recently revised version from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

In navigating our way through the issues of our time, we realize that a Catholic moral framework does not easily fit the ideologies of "right" and "left" nor the platforms of any party. Our values are often not "politically correct." So we ask how we can best promote a culture of life and seek to build it. "Living the Gospel of Life" uses the image of the person as the "Temple of the Holy Spirit" – the living house of God to help us weigh the issues. While we would consider issues of poverty, employment, and education as located at the crossbeams of the house, we would consider the protection of life itself at the foundation. Therefore, direct attacks on human life such as abortion and euthanasia strike at the very foundation of the house.

Come and speak up for life. Get on the bus that leaves from Chanhassen to come to what our bishops have made a day of prayer. The bus leaves for the Cathedral this Wednesday at 9:30 AM. After prayer at the Cathedral and the rally at the state capitol, the bus will return around 2:00 PM. Flyers with RSVP info. are located in the back of church. May we always live and speak the Gospel of Life.


