#### STATE OF THE PARISHES

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last week, I wrote about praying for our newly elected president, Congressional leaders, state leaders, and our country. This is a very civic-minded time, it seems to me, with last Thursday (January 22<sup>nd</sup>) as a day of penance as we pray for an end to abortion and a respect for life, as we remember Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and as we remember this week as a week of prayer for Christian Unity.

So now, I thought I'd write about the state of our parishes. We are seeing encouraging results from our preschool survey. As of Tuesday, January 21st, we have received 33 completed surveys, with most indicating a desire for all-day and year-round preschool. Of the respondents, 81% said that the most important factor in selecting a preschool was that the school be based in faith. 54% of the respondents said that it is very likely that, if the preschool were to open this autumn, they would enroll their children in the next 3 years, and 24% said that they would be equally as likely to send them to another preschool. If you feel that you could help us as part of a committee, let me know!

A contractor has been selected for the complete rebuilding of the school front steps. I offer a special thanks to those who have contributed to the school stairs fund, but also to all of you who have participated in the building up of our maintenance fund. This will be instrumental in helping us to open a new preschool and it is certainly not too late to make a donation. We anticipate that we would complete this project by July 15<sup>th</sup> of this year with a goal of opening up our preschool by this autumn.

Our monthly commission meetings to implement our new strategic plan have been productive and, I believe, have helped us to foster each other's collective efforts and begin to build upon successes. The Strengthening Finances Commission has spearheaded the effort to rebuild the school steps and pursue a new preschool with the help of Catholic Schools Center of Excellence (CSCOE). The Evangelization Commission has begun efforts toward increasing visibility and understanding of all that we have to offer. Soon we will have additional evangelization initiatives including joining the Latinos this spring and summer. The Youth, Young Adult, and Young Families Commission has helped us with an open house to showcase our faith formation, Catholic School Dollars for Scholars scholarship program, and hope for a preschool. The Sunday Experience Commission promoted a wonderful outdoor Mass last October at the prayer garden. Now it turns our focus on making the Mass time change go as smoothly as possible. Again, on March 2<sup>nd</sup> going forward, we will change our Sunday morning English Mass offerings to 7:30 AM Saint Nicholas and 9:00 AM Guardian Angels, and a Spanish Mass at 12 (noon).

#### A Word about Saint Paul

This Saturday, January 25<sup>th</sup> is the feast day of the Conversion of Saint Paul. It is the patronal feast day of our archdiocese as we remember our Mother Church, The Cathedral of Saint Paul. Saint Paul was born a Jew in the Roman city of Tarsus, which is now in modern day Turkey. As a Roman citizen, he was a devout Jew who persecuted Christians and approved the martyrdom of Saint Stephen. One can truly say that he was a man who stood at the center of various groups: Jew and Gentile, persecutor of Christians and devout follower of Christ, and missionary to the Gentiles.

In Acts 9: 15-16, Jesus appeared to Ananias and told him to go to Saul, lay his hands on him, heal him, and baptize him. Jesus explained that "this man is a chosen instrument of Mine to carry My name before Gentiles, kings, and Israelites, and I will show him what he will have to suffer for my name." We are all chosen instruments of God. We thank Saint Paul for his example to us of being ever-faithful in carrying out his role!


