## WALKING ON A PILGRIMAGE OF HOPE

I was thinking about the state of our parishes this past week and my reflection led me to the realization that it is not easy for Saint Nicholas parishioners to go from a Sunday morning Mass time of 10:00 AM to 7:30 AM. Nor is it easy to lose the every-Sunday services of our faithful visiting priest, Father Devorak. Also, from the standpoint of Guardian Angels, we will not go to one 9:00 AM Mass without adjustment. Furthermore, we have a parish debt of \$70,000 with a projected shortfall of an additional \$60,000 through June 30<sup>th</sup> of this year.

I believe that a good theme for this upcoming year is “Walking on a Pilgrimage of Hope.” I remember going on a pilgrimage to World Youth Day 2000 in Rome as a seminarian. It was very demanding and they say, to this day, that the temperatures in those days were record highs reaching about 100 degrees. I remember riding the subway to a field at Tor Vergata University where we were to celebrate the final Mass with Saint John Paul II with the other pilgrims in our group. The subway ride went on for two or three hours as it would repeatedly stop and then go again. It was extremely crowded and each time it stopped, the heat was almost unbearable. Then, we got off the subway and began walking. At that time, I didn’t have a sleeping bag with special material. Rather I had a rolled-up cloth sleeping bag that I placed my left arm through. That is how I carried my sleeping bag to the final Mass where we were to camp out overnight. It was all quite demanding as there were an estimated 2.1 million people there at that event.

So why do it? Why go on such a pilgrimage across the Atlantic where the logistics were so demanding at times that we barely had the opportunity to hear the scheduled talks about our faith. We could have saved the money and gone to other events of faith around here and it would have been easier. It is because we attend to ourselves spiritually in a different way when going on a pilgrimage. We go to different places where we see things through a different spiritual lens. Hope is also an element of a pilgrimage. Think of the wise men who went on a pilgrim’s journey, following the star, to see Jesus, a baby, lying in a manger. Did such a journey change them? Yes! Had they stayed home and prayed, it would have been good for them and for the world, but the journey really changed them. When we go on a pilgrimage, we hope to see Jesus himself in a different way. We hope to meet others who share the same hope, whom we otherwise would not have met without journeying on such a pilgrimage.

With the Jubilee Year of Hope declared by Pope Francis, I believe that we should celebrate this hope and have this hope. But, I also believe that we cannot stay put in the way that we have existed before. We must rise and be on our way with Jesus. We cannot do things in the same manner as before in order to truly respond in faith in Jesus, given our situation. Our hope must be marked by a walk to a new place in our parish histories. Such a walk is not easy! Think of the Israelites who journeyed through a desert, out of slavery, yes, but through a desert. But what did they find in the end? They found freedom in a Promised Land. We will get to that land for us as the Churches of Chaska and Carver. Let us begin the journey with great hope and faith in our Lord!
