THE TRANSFORMATIVE POWER OF LENT IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

With Lent quickly approaching and this Wednesday being Ash Wednesday, I look forward to this upcoming season with you. Lent is a time in which we, together as a whole Church, go on a 40-day retreat of interior spiritual renewal. It is a season of grace and a time to consider what we will do with this season that God gives us. It is a time of spiritual spring housecleaning in which we experience less of those things that distract us so that we can experience more of God's abundance. It is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving so that we can experience this transformation. Together, we heed in a more concerted way the call of our Lord Jesus to offer our works of charity, known as almsgiving, especially to those who need it most. As our prayer, almsgiving, and practices of penance including fasting is made more intense, we recognize that Lent is a time not so much of less, but of more. It is a time of finding the interior freedom needed to give more of ourselves to our God and to our neighbor.

Lent is a time in which the Old and New Testaments and the Gospels that we will hear are meant to trouble us. They are meant to help us confront our illusions about ourselves, let go of our pride, and embrace humility. "Remember you are dust and unto dust you shall return." Our prayer, penance, and almsgiving will begin to help bring ourselves to the Lenten resolutions that we make in response to those scriptures. At the same time, even if we fail in those resolutions, they may in a mysterious way have greater effect than if we had succeeded in them, since they are not meant to confirm us in our sense of virtue, but to bring home to us our radical need of salvation. May our new understanding of this radical need help us to receive our Lord's sacrifice of himself on the cross now given in the Holy Eucharist more fervently, with greater awe and devotion. May our greater devotion to Him lead us to climb the holy mountain of Easter and be changed forever at the mountain top of the resurrection.

Again, I look forward to our upcoming Lenten journey together toward a lasting change of heart for each one of us.

PENANCE, FASTING, AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS

The Practice of Penance

As a practice of self-denial, thereby uniting ourselves to the sufferings of Christ, and of renewal of the virtue of temperance, the divine law binds us to do penance throughout the year each in his or her own way. However, in order that we are united among ourselves by some common observance, the Church has prescribed all Fridays throughout the year and the season of Lent as penitential days.

On Fridays Throughout the Year

On Fridays throughout the year, with the exception of days that are listed as a solemnity, the Catholic faithful are bound to do a specific act of penance each in his or her own way.

What are the regulations for penance, fasting and abstinence during Lent?

The Penitential days of Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes with the celebration of the Paschal Triduum. During this time the whole Church is invited to do penance in order to purify our hearts in preparation to celebrate the renewal of our baptismal promises on Easter Sunday. The following regulations should be observed by Catholics during Lent:

Abstinence

Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. It is only on other Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, that a Catholic may substitute another form of penance instead of abstinence.

Fasting

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days one full meal is allowed. Food may be taken at two other times during the day, in order to maintain strength according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed, however.

Sacrament of Penance

All the faithful who have reached the age of reason (second grade) are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year. Lent is a good time to fulfill this precept of the Church. Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion without previously having been to sacramental confession (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1457). Of course, frequent confession, even of venial sins, is highly recommended to grow in God's grace (CCC, #1458).

Other Lenten Observances

Each weekday of Lent, with the exception of Solemnities, is also an obligatory day of penance and should be marked by prayer and increased devotion to spiritual practices. Some recommendations to fulfill this obligation include the participation in daily Mass, increased personal prayer time or spiritual study, self-imposed fasting or abstinence, works of charity, financial generosity to programs which benefit others, especially the poor, and participation in traditional Lenten Devotions (Stations of the Cross, Rosary, Retreats, Parish Missions, etc.). The goal of all our Lenten disciplines is the conversion of our hearts. As the Catechism states, "interior conversion urges expression in visible signs, gestures and works of penance" (CCC, #1430). These penances help us to "repent" as the Lord asks, by redirecting our whole life toward God and away from the sin and evil which wounds our nature (CCC, #1430-1439).

CATHOLIC SERVICES APPEAL

Jesus' call to "do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6: 31) seems doable – until it applies to those who have hurt us. The "others" Jesus refers to aren't limited to our family and friends who treat us with respect. "Others" includes the difficult people in our lives, even the malignant ones. He is asking us to transfer the kind of love reserved for ourselves and our loved ones to those who may very well be undeserving – when viewed exclusively through their actions – but who are children of God and thus merit love and respect. Elsewhere, Jesus says, "Even the pagans do good to those who do good to them."

If we are to love as God loves, we must focus more on others and less on ourselves. There is no "what's in it for me" in Jesus' message. In fact, Jesus offers numerous examples of how the love He is calling us to is anything but reciprocal. Someone takes your coat? Give him the shirt off your back. Suffer a strike across one cheek? Turn to offer your assailant the other one. Someone wishes you ill? Bless them and wish them well. Are you the recipient of mistreatment? Pray for the perpetrator.

Jesus is holding us to a very high standard. Be generous, be loving, and expect nothing in return. We do this when, as parents, we spend the night tending to a sick child or spend hours consoling a friend who has lost her husband. But this is service given to those we know and love. When we give to those we never meet by supporting the Catholic Services Appeal, we are answering Christ's call to "lend expecting nothing back" (Luke 6: 35).
