

THE GUARDIAN ANGELS ARE OUR HEAVENLY COMPANIONS

Do you know who is your best and most faithful friend? It is one whom God Himself has placed at your side as a life companion – your Guardian Angel. God in His goodness has appointed him to guide and protect you through life and to lead you safely to your Eternal Home. From the very first moment of your existence, your Guardian Angel has been concerned about you. He rejoiced like your mother when you were born into the world. From the day of your Baptism, you became ever more dearer to your Guardian Angel and

ever more loved. He watched at your cradle and led you as you took your first steps. He cared for you with most tender love when danger threatened.

He also grieved when you committed sin, as if he himself had received the greatest injury, and he left you no peace until you became reconciled with God by a good Confession. He has watched and prayed with you in hours of distress and rejoiced with you in days of prosperity. Your Guardian Angel was with you attending to your soul on the day of your First Communion and as long as you received the Bread of Angels in the state of grace, he has rejoiced to accompany you to the Holy Table. And he it was who prayed for you specially when the hand of the bishop anointed you and sent you as His servant in the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Our Guardian Angel is our best counselor, particularly as he assists young men and women in their choice of vocation. He will shield you from the dangers of the world when we call upon him and help us to find our life companion whom God has destined for us. Our Guardian Angel will always be at our side so that we may faithfully carry out our duties according to our state in life.

In short, your Guardian Angel is your companion in all the circumstances of life. Our catechism, in paragraph #336 says, "From infancy to death human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession. Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life. Already here on earth the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angles and men united to God."

They are spiritual creatures who glorify God and work for our salvation. The whole life of the Church benefits from the mysterious and powerful help of the angels. So in her liturgy, the Church joins with the angels to adore the Triune God. She invokes their assistance in the Eucharistic prayers. For example, in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I), we pray, "In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God: command that these gifts be borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high in the sight of your divine majesty, so that all of us who through this participation at the altar receive the most holy Body and Blood of your Son may be filled with every grace and heavenly blessing..." Thus, the Church venerates angels who lead us on our pilgrimage to God and protect every human being.

One day, our Guardian Angel will assist us in our very last conflict. Then he will fight with you and for you, until you have won the battle and your heart is at rest and ready for the kingdom. But even then, your Guardian Angel will accompany you when the light of earth fades away and the brightness of eternity bursts upon you. Then, your Guardian Angel will present your soul before the tribunal of God and faithfully plead your cause. And even if your soul will require purification in the flames of purgatory, your holy angel will visit and console you until he is able to lead you to the kingdom of heaven.

But, to benefit from the presence of this heavenly companion, you must be docile to his inspirations and not turn away from this holy Angel who is your guide and protector. May we always hope in the personal love of God who appoints a Guardian Angel to lead us safely to His kingdom! May we do so collectively as a parish, as a Church – The Churches of the Guardian Angels and Saint Nicholas.

44TH ANNUAL MN FOODSHARE MARCH CAMPAIGN

Now in its 44th year, the Minnesota Food Share statewide campaign brings awareness to the need for food shelves while collecting critical food and funds at a time when inventories are at their lowest following the holidays. This collaborative effort unites organizations, businesses, faith communities, and individuals to support over 300 food shelves across the state.

At Bountiful Basket Food Shelf, we're committed to eliminating food insecurity for the 9,000+ individuals we serve annually. Over the past year, we experienced a 72% increase in individuals served, underscoring the growing need in our community. In response, we expanded our capacity with the opening of a second site in Cologne in 2023 and an off-site pantry at West Creek Apartments in 2024. These milestones, alongside launching additional mobile deliveries, school snack and weekend food programs to our local schools, foster care and immunization food bag initiatives with the county, and more—have resulted in a remarkable 226% increase in individuals served since 2022.

This growth is part of a larger trend across Minnesota, where food insecurity is rising at unprecedented rates. Feeding America reports that 537,890 Minnesotans, including 34% under age 10, are facing hunger. In 2024, Minnesotans made a record-breaking 9 million visits to food shelves, a 20% increase from the previous record of 7.5 million in 2023 and 150% higher than pre-pandemic levels. The state's charitable food system, including food shelves like Bountiful Basket, is operating at capacity as families struggle with rising food prices, inflation, and stagnant wage growth. While statewide efforts have made strides in combating hunger, the demand for emergency food assistance continues to grow.

With your support, Bountiful Basket Food Shelf remains determined to meet these challenges and needs head-on. Together, we can ensure that everyone who walks through our doors feels welcomed, supported, and empowered to address their food needs. Thank you for being part of this critical mission.

PENANCE, FASTING, AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS

The Practice of Penance

As a practice of self-denial, thereby uniting ourselves to the sufferings of Christ, and of renewal of the virtue of temperance, the divine law binds us to do penance throughout the year each in his or her own way. However, in order that we are united among ourselves by some common observance, the Church has prescribed all Fridays throughout the year and the season of Lent as penitential days.

On Fridays Throughout the Year

On Fridays throughout the year, with the exception of days that are listed as a solemnity, the Catholic faithful are bound to do a specific act of penance each in his or her own way.

What are the regulations for penance, fasting and abstinence during Lent?

The Penitential days of Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes with the celebration of the Paschal Triduum. During this time the whole Church is invited to do penance in order to purify our hearts in preparation to celebrate the renewal of our baptismal promises on Easter Sunday. The following regulations should be observed by Catholics during Lent:

Abstinence

Catholics 14 years of age and older must abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent. It is only on other Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, that a Catholic may substitute another form of penance instead of abstinence.

Fasting

Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days one full meal is allowed. Food may be taken at two other times during the day, in order to maintain strength according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed, however.

Sacrament of Penance

All the faithful who have reached the age of reason (second grade) are bound faithfully to confess their grave sins at least once a year. Lent is a good time to fulfill this precept of the Church. Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion without previously having been to sacramental confession (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1457). Of course, frequent confession, even of venial sins, is highly recommended to grow in God's grace (CCC, #1458).

Other Lenten Observances

Each weekday of Lent, with the exception of Solemnities, is also an obligatory day of penance and should be marked by prayer and increased devotion to spiritual practices. Some recommendations to fulfill this obligation include the participation in daily Mass, increased personal prayer time or spiritual study, self-imposed fasting or abstinence, works of charity, financial generosity to programs which benefit others, especially the poor, and participation in traditional Lenten Devotions (Stations of the Cross, Rosary, Retreats, Parish Missions, etc.). The goal of all our Lenten disciplines is the conversion of our hearts. As the Catechism states, "interior conversion urges expression in visible signs, gestures and works of penance" (CCC, #1430). These penances help us to "repent" as the Lord asks, by redirecting our whole life toward God and away from the sin and evil which wounds our nature (CCC, #1430-1439).


