WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO REPENT AND WHY IS LENT SUCH A POWERFUL TIME TO DO SO?

Lent is an ideal time to draw closer to God as we remember the gospel stories of Jesus that lead up to His passion. Jesus said, “If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross daily and follow Me” (Luke 9:23). So, as Jesus’ passion nears, we do just this as His disciples in a more intense way. But as we do so, we find those areas in our lives in which we are not walking with Him and turn back to Him.

To repent is to turn away from sin and self-centeredness and to turn to God through a return to the Sacrament of Reconciliation and to prayer. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a place to meet again with the God who loves us. He loves us so much that there is more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over 99 who have no need for repentance (Luke 15:7).

Prayer comes in two major forms: communal and private. We do not live as autonomous individuals. We need community and it is God’s design that we come together as His baptized family to worship the one Lord, Jesus. Please plan to attend Mass every Sunday. Mass is also offered on weekdays and isn’t it beautiful that we can receive His body and blood during the week as well as on Sunday? We also have the Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 7:00 PM as another Lenten devotional practice. And we have Eucharistic Adoration each Thursday in front of the Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance. What a great opportunity to come to our Lord Jesus!

Private prayer is the other half of a well-balanced prayer life. This Lent please reserve some time each day to be alone. We have many ways to pray including silent meditation, scripture reading and reflection, the rosary and other composed prayers, singing sacred music, a prayer walk outside, or viewing and meditating upon religious artworks. But in any case, prayer is not doing much, it is loving much. So we become aware of the thoughts, feelings, and desires of our hearts and relate them to God, rather than just thinking and ruminating about them. Then, we be quiet and wait for God to respond. Sometimes it doesn’t seem at all that God is responding, but He is. We can only look back at our lives over a longer period of time to know this and see His goodness! Regular communication is key to any relationship and it is no different for ourselves and God. If we hope to be closer to God, regular prayer is indispensable.

Why Don’t Catholics Eat Meat on Fridays?

Catholics abstain from flesh meat on days of penance, such as Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays of Lent, and this is called abstinence. Abstinence is one of the oldest Christian traditions. “From the first century, the day of the crucifixion has been traditionally observed as a day of abstaining from flesh meat to honor Christ who sacrificed his flesh on a Friday” (Klein, P., Catholic Source Book, 93). Canon law actually calls for abstinence from eating meat on all Fridays of the year. However, the bishops of the United States have determined that, outside of the Fridays of Lent, Catholics may choose to substitute another penance that is particularly meaningful to them, although the bishops continue to recommend abstinence on all Fridays for Catholics. It is required of all Catholics age fourteen and older. Fish has never been understood in our tradition to be considered meat. In former times, meat was more expensive, eaten occasionally, and associated with feasting and rejoicing; whereas fish were cheaper, eaten more often, and not associated with celebrations. Of course, we do not want to defeat the self-denying purpose by giving up flesh meat only to feast on lobster or king crab. May God bless our Lenten practices of self-denial together.

44TH ANNUAL MN FOODSHARE MARCH CAMPAIGN

March 1st, 2025 to April 6th, 2025
All food and funds proportionally matched!

Now in its 44th year, the Minnesota Food Share statewide campaign brings awareness to the need for food shelves while collecting critical food and funds at a time when inventories are at their lowest following the holidays. This collaborative effort unites organizations, businesses, faith communities, and individuals to support over 300 food shelves across the state.

At Bountiful Basket Food Shelf, we're committed to eliminating food insecurity for the 9,000+ individuals we serve annually. Over the past year, we experienced a 72% increase in individuals served, underscoring the growing need in our community. In response, we expanded our capacity with the opening of a second site in Cologne in 2023 and an off-site pantry at West Creek Apartments in 2024. These milestones, alongside launching additional mobile deliveries, school snack and weekend food programs to our local schools, foster care and immunization food bag initiatives with the county, and more—have resulted in a remarkable 226% increase in individuals served since 2022.

This growth is part of a larger trend across Minnesota, where food insecurity is rising at unprecedented rates. Feeding America reports that 537,890 Minnesotans, including 34% under age 10, are facing hunger. In 2024, Minnesotans made a record-breaking 9 million visits to food shelves, a 20% increase from the previous record of 7.5 million in 2023 and 150% higher than pre-pandemic levels. The state's charitable food system, including food shelves like Bountiful Basket, is operating at capacity as families struggle with rising food prices, inflation, and stagnant wage growth. While statewide efforts have made strides in combating hunger, the demand for emergency food assistance continues to grow.

With your support, Bountiful Basket Food Shelf remains determined to meet these challenges and needs head-on. Together, we can ensure that everyone who walks through our doors feels welcomed, supported, and empowered to address their food needs. Thank you for being part of this critical mission.

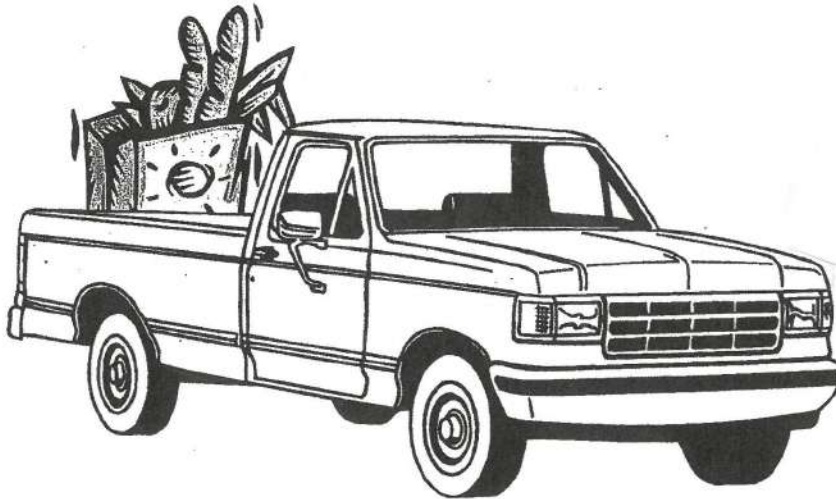

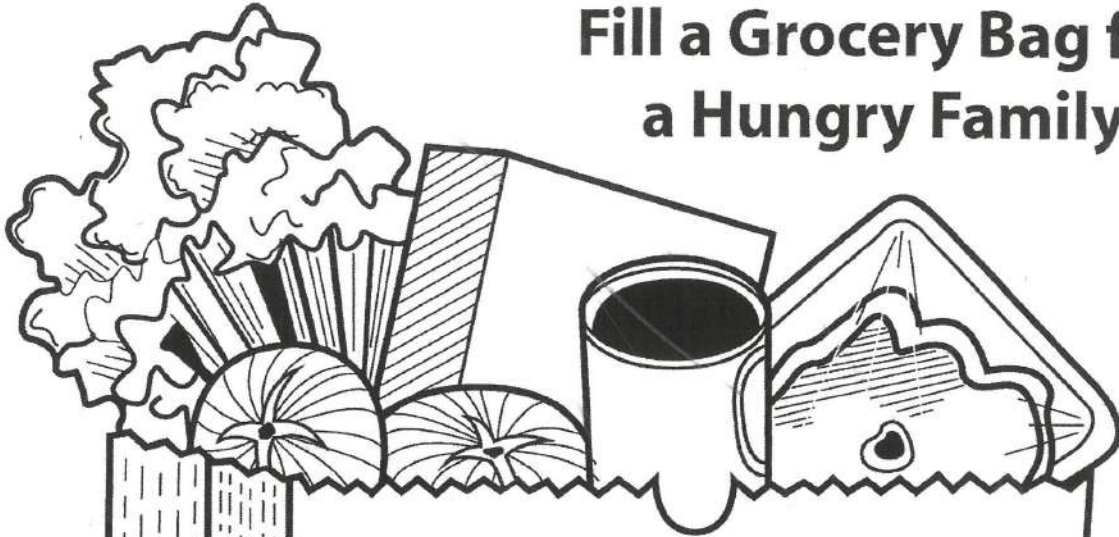
