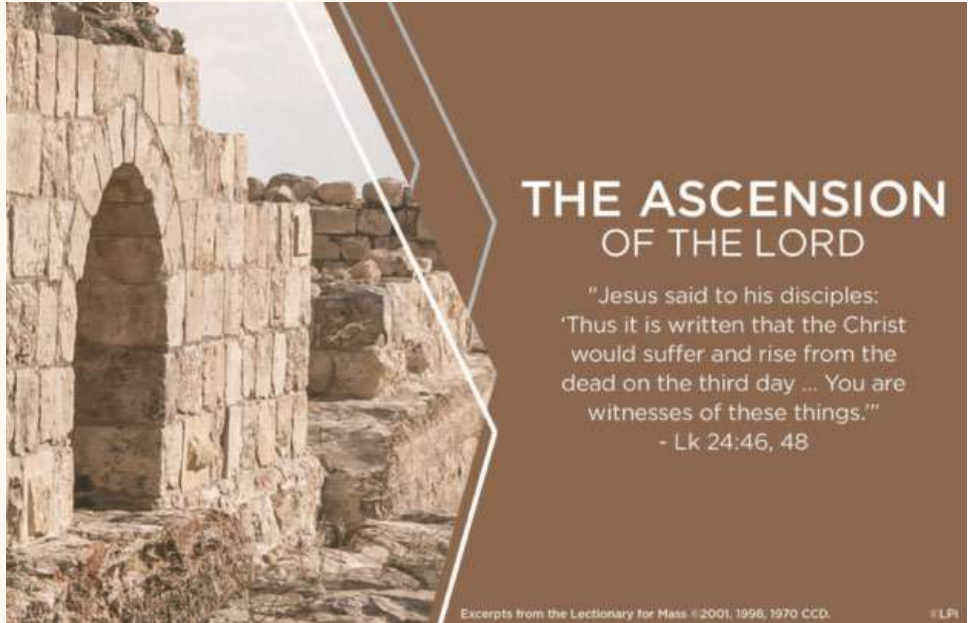

JESUS IS MORE PRESENT TO US NOW, NOT LESS

Jesus was in his very person, the meeting of heaven and earth. In Him, God and humanity came together. His entire ministry was the outward expression of this inward identity. His whole work, it could be said, was the bringing of humanity and divinity together. In the Lord's prayer, we say, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." This sums it up! In His passion and death, Jesus effectively brought heaven all the way down. He carried the divine life and light into the darkest places of humanity – places of hatred, cruelty, violence, and corruption. The divine life is brought into even the darkest aspects of earth. We know from the resurrection that heaven transforms even those places and the divine love is more powerful. This is the Good News. In the face of all of the corrupt kingdoms of the world, the Church announces that God is king!

In light of this basic gospel message, we hear at the Ascension of our Lord that Jesus spoke of the kingdom of God and the reign of God. The disciples have been given power and a new commission to tell everyone of this Good News. Then Jesus was taken up into heaven. But we should not think of this spatially as though he escaped from earth and went away from humanity. Rather, Jesus from heaven, is now reigning over the earth. We hear that He is seated at the right hand of the Father. This is symbolic language that lets us know that he is reigning over earth on behalf of the Father.

So our Lord Jesus is more, not less, present to us here on earth. He is directing the things of earth and of the Church from his place in heaven. He is not present in human form only to Israel, but in His glorified body he is present to all of creation. And he continues the work of building up his kingdom here below. Think of hiking up a mountain. From the vantage point of the summit we see all around us and, in a sense, are present to what is all around us.

So the Ascension forces us to ask, who do we finally obey? Do we allow him to direct all that is happening here below? Our Lord is not a figure of the past to be vaguely remembered, but here present with us now from heaven. This is why the angel says, "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" It is as if the angel is saying, "Get to work. You have a king with your marching orders to build up the kingdom under His direction." We have many gifts with which God has blessed us to do that with. May we use them all to His glory and under His command and direction. May God bless you all.

Dear Parishioners,
Ken and Laurie Forner and Doug and Vi Wentz have been chosen as our delegates to participate in the 2025 Be My Witnesses Assembly at Cretin-Derham Hall and the Cathedral on Saturday, June 7th. This is a monumental event for our parishes and our archdiocese because we will pray, reflect, and learn as a way to kickoff Year III of the synod implementation process. The theme for this year is that parents are the primary educators for their children. Parents, we want to help you and we will! Of course, we will continue our small groups and our emphasis on the Mass. But I want to invite you to participate in the Be My Witnesses Assembly in a remote way as well. I invite you to watch videos about the 12 top-voted propositions at www.archspm.org/synodpropositions. Additionally, attend the holy hour at the Cathedral of Saint Paul on Friday, June 6th at 7:00 p.m. All are welcome to join the bishops in prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit upon all Synod 2025 members who dialogue and vote as we enter Pentecost weekend and the Synod 2025: Be My Witnesses Assembly. Thirdly, I invite you to attend the Pentecost Vigil Mass beginning at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 7th at the Cathedral. This solemnity commemorates the Birth of the Church in the Holy Spirit and is followed by praise and worship, with prayer teams available. In the past several years, this liturgy has played an important role in first the Synod process and now implementation. That continues in 2025, as the Vigil will conclude the one-day Be My Witnesses Assembly through which the Archdiocesan mission priorities for Years 4 and 5 will be discerned.

We will be having the Rummage Sale this year in June, so keep us in mind when you're doing your spring cleaning.

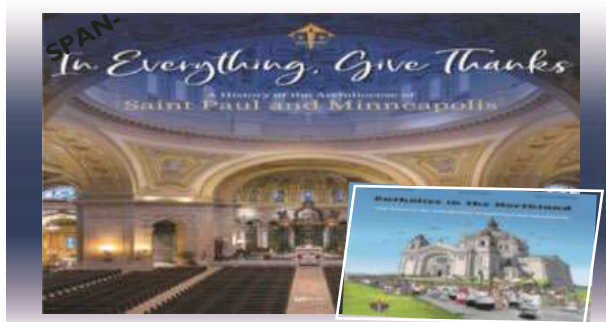

ARCHBISHOP HEBDA INVITES YOU TO BECOME AN ARCHDIOCESAN JUBILEE PILGRIM!

Editor's note: Parts of this announcement are taken as excerpts from Archbishop's Weekly Word sent by email on May 19th.

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Christ,

This weekend, you might have noticed something new at your parish. Maybe it was hanging in your church's front entrance, or perhaps you noticed it in the parish hall while you were having coffee and donuts. Wherever it might be, I suspect that it will be hard to miss: It's a large, blue poster marking the 175th anniversary of the Archdiocese and inviting you to be an Archdiocesan Jubilee Pilgrim.

The Archdiocese was erected by Pope Pius IX on July 19, 1850, formed from territory that had previously been under the jurisdiction of the Archdiocese of Dubuque and the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. In the midst of the Universal Church's Jubilee Year, we hope to celebrate our 175th as well, beginning with a Mass at the Cathedral of Saint Paul on Saturday evening, July 19, 2025.

To whet our appetites for the anniversary celebration, we are beginning our Archdiocesan Passport Adventure this weekend. We wanted to begin this adventure while we were still involved in the implementation of our Year 2 pastoral letter focus: the Mass. When we introduced Year 2, you might remember that I encouraged all the faithful to visit a variety of local parishes, as a way of deepening our appreciation of the liturgy and celebrating the diverse gifts we've enjoyed in this archdiocese for 175 years. Now, on our Archdiocesan website, you can download and print a passport at archspm.org/passport and truly take to the road this summer and fall.

Here's the challenge: Visit at least seven churches "new" to you between now and October and log them in your passport. Then join me or one of our auxiliary bishops on Sunday, October 12, at the Cathedral of Saint Paul. There will be an ice cream social after all morning Masses on that date, and we'll have a special celebration for all who've participated in this Archdiocesan Passport Adventure.

There are many different ways to fill out your passport this summer. Since none of the Churches are "new" to me, I'm thinking of visiting seven of our "border" parishes -- have you ever been to Immaculate Conception in Marysburg, St. Luke in Clearwater, St. Michael in Pine Island, Sacred Heart in Rush City, St. Mary in Waverly, St. Patrick in Oak Grove, or St. Joseph in Taylors Falls? Perhaps you would rather visit seven of the parishes where Mass is celebrated in another language or find the parishes where the liturgy is celebrated in a different rite.

You may find out when different parishes are celebrating Mass by using the parish finder page on our website at archspm.org/parishes. Or look on each parish's website to see if there's an event coming up that you and your family and friends can attend.

As you make these mini pilgrimages across the archdiocese, this is a chance for all of us to be more unified as a local church. If you listened to Pope Leo's homily yesterday, you would have heard that he's hoping to unify our Church. We are one body, made up of many parts; our local church is comprised of many parishes making up one body.

We hope that you can take part in this enjoyable summer activity of being a pilgrim of hope for our Archdiocese and our parishes!

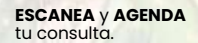
